So far as is reasonably practicable, political proportionality has been achieved.

The principles of the allocation of seats to political groups:

Section 15 of the Local Government and Housing Act 1989 and the Local Government (Committees and Political Groups) Regulations, the City Council has a duty to review the representation of different political groups at its Annual Meeting in respect of bodies to which the section applies. Section 15 provides that, in performing this duty, the council has a duty to make only such determinations as give effect so far as reasonably practicable to the following principles:

- (a) that not all the seats on committees are allocated to the same political group;
- (b) that the majority of the seats on each committee are allocated to a particular political group if the number of persons belonging to that group are a majority of the authority's membership;
- (c) subject to (a) and (b), that the number of seats on committees which are allocated to each group bears the same proportion to the total of all the seats on committees of the council as is borne by the number of members of that group to the membership of the authority, and
- (d) Subject to (a) to (c) above, that the number of seats on each committee which are allocated to each political group bears the same proportion to the number of all the seats on that committee as is borne by the number of members of that group to the membership of the authority.

The application of those principles is set out below.

Principle (a) – The seats will be allocated amongst the Labour, Conservative and UKIP groups.

Principle (b) – As no group has an overall majority on the Council, this principle does not apply.

Principle (c) The allocation of seats on all committees is based on the group's percentage of total Council membership is as set out above.

Principle (d) Subject to (a) to (c), each group has the same proportion of seats on each committee as it holds on the Council as a whole.

I. Authority and responsibilities

- 1.1 The Assistant Director for Finance is the officer who has statutory responsibility to ensure the proper administration of the Council's financial affairs by virtue of section 151 of the Local Government Act 1972 and is required to hold appropriate skills and qualifications to undertake this role.
- 1.2 The appointment of the Section 151 Officer/Responsible Finance Officer is personal to that officer and once appointed by Council s/he has personal responsibilities to the Council as a whole.
- 1.2 The Council's Constitution (Part A, Section 10.4) sets out the main duties of the Responsible Finance Officer/Section 151 Officer:
 - (a) To make sure decisions are lawful and financially prudent. After consulting with the Head of Paid Service and the Monitoring Officer, the Responsible Finance Officer will report to the Full Council and the Council's external auditor if he/she considers that any proposal, decision or course of action would incur unlawful expenditure, or is unlawful and is likely to cause a loss or deficiency, or if the Council is about to enter an item of account unlawfully.
 - (b) **To administer financial affairs.** The Responsible Finance Officer will have responsibility for the administration of the financial affairs of the Council.
 - (c) **To contribute to corporate management.** The Responsible Finance Officer will contribute to the corporate management of the Council, in particular through the provision of professional financial advice.
 - (d) **To provide advice.** The Responsible Finance Officer or designee will provide advice on the scope of powers and authority to take decisions, maladministration, financial impropriety, probity and budget and policy framework issues to all Councillors and will support and advise Councillors and officers in their respective roles.
 - (e) **Providing financial information.** The Responsible Finance Officer or designee will provide financial information to the media, members of the public and the community.
 - (f) **Restrictions on Post.** The Responsible Finance Officer cannot be the Monitoring Office. The Head of Paid Service and the Responsible Finance Officer can be the same person but the Responsible Finance Officer must be a qualified accountant.
- 1.3 The \$151 officer may deputise his duties to another officer, it may not, however, be to the Head of Paid Service or the Monitoring Officer who are not allowed to hold the \$151 officer role.

2. Recruitment

2.1 At its meeting held on 23 February 2015, Council appointed the existing Deputy \$151 Officer (David Northey) as the Council's interim Assistant Director for Finance Section 151 officer pending the appointment of a permanent \$151 officer following external advertisement.

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In the meantime, the recruitment process for a replacement Assistant Director for Finance commenced.

On 17 March, the Appointments Panel agreed to appoint Andrew Hardingham as the Council's Assistant Director for Finance.

The Constitution requires notification of the proposed appointment to be given to each member of the Cabinet to give them an opportunity to object to the proposal. Such notification has been given to the Cabinet and no objections were received.

3. Council approval

The \$151 responsibilities are included in the role profile of the Assistant Director for Finance but the designation of an officer to act as Responsible Finance Officer (\$151 officer) is a decision for Full Council.
