Purpose of the report:

A notification has been received from Michael Currie for Kernow Mobile Bars of 4 Gear Drive, Quintrell Downs, Newquay, Cornwall in respect of a community event at Pembroke Street Community Estate Plymouth for a Temporary Event Notice under Section 100 of the Licensing Act 2003.

1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 On the 05 July 2017 Mr Michael Currie of Kernow Mobile Bars at 4 Gear Drive, Quintrell Downs Newquay, Cornwall gave a temporary event notice under Section 100 of the Licensing Act 2003 to the Licensing Authority. A copy of the notice was served on Devon and Cornwall Police and Environmental Health department

1.2 The notification is in respect of an event to take place at the Pembroke Street Community Estate, Devonport, Plymouth.

1.3 Nature of the event:

Community event to be held in the grounds of the Pembroke Community Estate with a mobile bar for a maximum of 220 persons on Saturday 22 July 2017 from 5.00pm to 11.00pm.

The licensable activities intended within the notice are:

The sale by retail of alcohol

1.4 Devon and Cornwall Police have given notice to the Licensing Authority that they are satisfied that allowing the premises to be used in accordance with the notice would undermine the crime prevention objective. They have also served notice on Mr Currie. (APPENDIX I)

1.5 Any person over 18 years of age, may give a Temporary Event Notice in respect of permitted temporary activities, intended to take place other than under a licence. This may include:

* The sale by retail of alcohol

* The supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club

* The provision of regulated entertainment

* The provision of late night refreshment

1.6 A temporary event notice must be given to the Licensing Authority the Police and Environmental Health department not less than 10 working days before the event takes place.

1.7 Only the Police and Environmental Health department are able to make objections in respect of a Temporary Event Notice on the basis of any of the four licensing objectives.

2.0 CONSIDERATIONS

2.1 The Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives.

2.2 The Committee may decide to allow licensable activities to go ahead as stated in the notice. If the notice is in connection with licensable activities at licensed premises the committee may also impose one or more of the existing conditions on the notice insofar as such conditions are not inconsistent with the event if it considers that this is appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

2.3 In making its decision the Committee is also obliged to have regard to:

- the guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 with the following paragraph's 7.32 – 7.35, 7.36, 7.37 – 7.38

- the Council's own Licensing Policy with the following headed paragraphs being relevant to this application. Temporary Event Notices (TEN's) (Page 24).

- Also the representations (including supporting information) presented by all the parties.

2.4 If the committee decides to impose conditions it must give notice to the premises user which

includes a statement of conditions, alternatively it can decide that the event would undermine the licensing objectives and should not take place therefore issuing a counter notice.
