1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 On the 16th April 2019 Eleanor Venables gave two temporary event notices under Section 100 of the Licensing Act 2003 to the Licensing Authority. A copy of the notice was served on Devon and Cornwall Police and Environmental Health department

1.2 The notification is in respect of an event to take place at Plymouth Albion. 25 Damerel Close, Devonport, Plymouth. PL1 4NE

1.3 Nature of the events:

1. Outdoor adventure cinema film showing to be held on the 9th and 10th May 2019 between 5pm and 11.30pm for up to 499 people.
2. Boxing Event to be held on the 24th May 2019 between 5pm and 11.30pm for up to 250 people

The licensable activities intended within the notice are:

The provision of regulated entertainment on the 9th & 10th May 2019

The sale by retail of alcohol and the provision of regulated entertainment on the 24th May 2019

1.4 Plymouth City Council Environmental Health department have given notice to the Licensing Authority that they are satisfied that allowing the premises to be used in accordance with the notice would undermine the public safety licensing objectives. They have also served notice on Eleanor Venables. (Appendix 1 and 2)

1.5 Any person over 18 years of age, may give a Temporary Event Notice in respect of permitted temporary activities, intended to take place other than under a licence. This may include:

- * The sale by retail of alcohol
- * The supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club
- * The provision of regulated entertainment
- * The provision of late night refreshment

1.6 A temporary event notice must be given to the Licensing Authority the Police and Environmental Health department not less than 10 working days before the event takes place.

1.7 Only the Police and Environmental Health department are able to make objections in respect of a Temporary Event Notice on the basis of any of the four licensing objectives.

2.0 CONSIDERATIONS

2.1 The Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives.

2.2 The Committee may decide to allow licensable activities to go ahead as stated in the notice. If the notice is in connection with licensable activities at licensed premises the committee may also impose one or more of the existing conditions on the notice insofar as such conditions are not inconsistent with the event if it considers that this is appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

2.3 In making its decision the Committee is also obliged to have regard to the guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Council's own Licensing Policy and the representations (including supporting information) presented by all the parties.

2.4 If the committee decides to impose conditions it must give notice to the premises user which

includes a statement of conditions, alternatively it can decide that the event would undermine the licensing objectives and should not take place therefore issuing a counter notice.
