The intention is to have group participation across the life course of a person and there is excellent partnership representation including education, children &amp; families services, health, public health, police, RPC, NSPCC. Representatives from Derriford Hospital maternity and the CYP worker from the Refuge are now also on board.</li> <li>Spent time reflecting upon the core values of a trauma informed group / system and how we as a group will embed these values.</li> <li>Reflected upon the priorities of the Safer Plymouth partnership.</li> <li>Spent time identifying possible areas of delivery consistent with current priorities and ACEs prevention.</li> </ul>
What are we worried about?	Ensuring we can add value and enact meaningful change against the priorities and the intention to be more trauma informed.
What needs to happen?	The next step is to further define priorities for the group to provide a focus for our work moving forward.

SECTION B	
What is working well?	<ul> <li>Despite not being able to have a formal meeting, the network of Safer People and its links with Safer Communities is already having an impact upon partnership working. On 2 March 2020 the Chairs of both Safer People and Safer Communities presented "Preventing Exploitation in Sport" at a Prevent Conference at Plymouth Argyle Football Club to sports designated safeguarding leads.</li> <li>Work on responding effectively to children and young people displaying, or at risk of displaying harmful sexual behaviour has also commenced. Partnership work with the NPSCC lead to the launch of the Harmful Sexual Behaviour Audit and Framework in Plymouth on 27 February 2020.</li> <li>Work within the network, and cross-partnerships is effective in developing a new learning model for serious reviews, e.g. child safeguarding practice reviews, domestic homicide reviews, and serious adult reviews.</li> </ul>
What are we worried about?	Understanding and implementing a contextual safeguarding framework across the City remains underdeveloped. However, creative and dynamic work is being planned to operate a sector based approach to contextual safeguarding commencing with Retail and work within the Bar Code.
