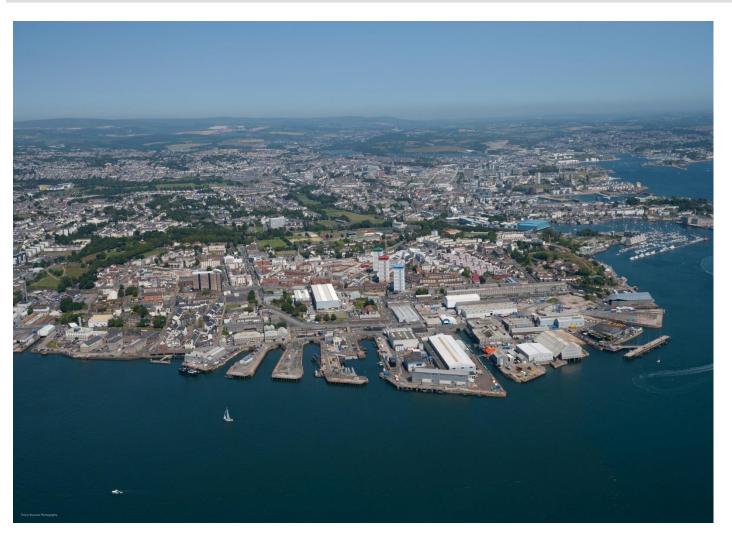

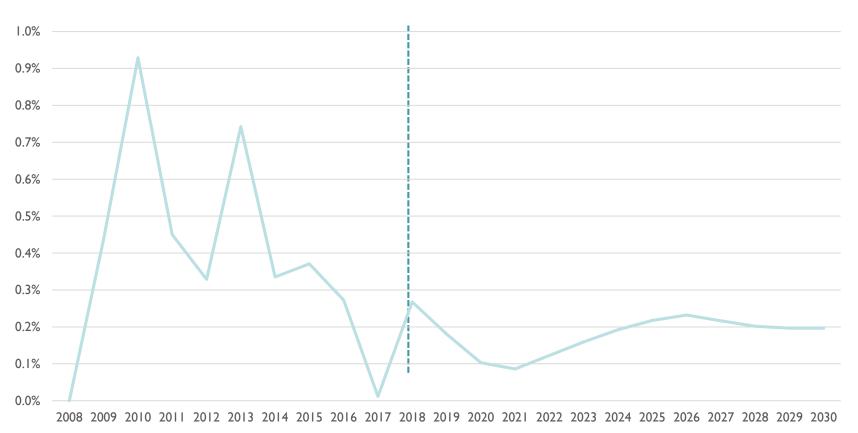


#### **Population Growth**

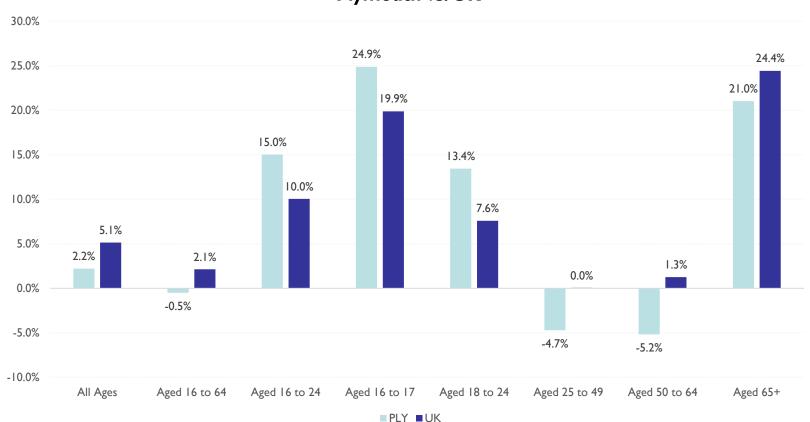

#### Projected Population Growth between 2018 and 2030, by Age Groups - Plymouth vs. UK

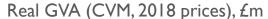


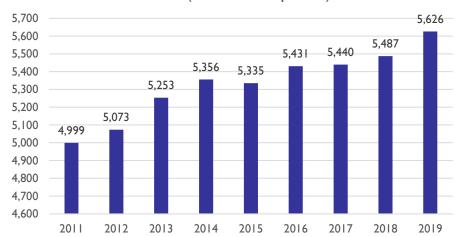

#### **GVA** and **Productivity**



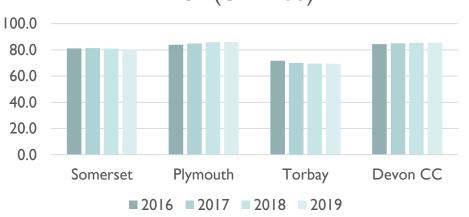




Plymouth's economy has been growing, but not as fast as nationally.

Nominal GVA per hour worked Index (UK=100)

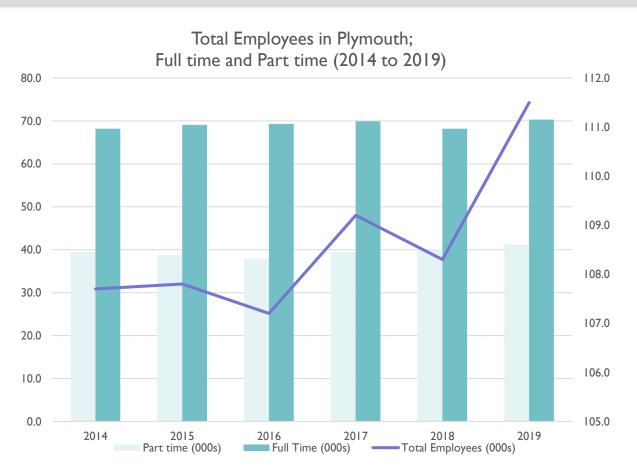

Total employees in Plymouth has risen by only 3.5% from 2014 to 2019. This is less than both the South West (6.2%) and the UK (7.72%).

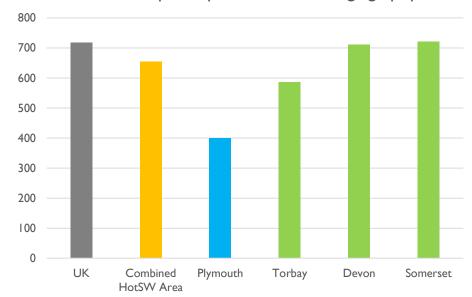

Active Enterprises per 10,000 working age pop.



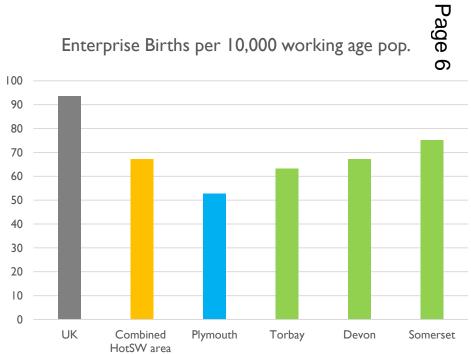
Enterprise birth rates are also low in Plymouth.

Despite some year-on-year fluctuation, this rate has not seen any significant increase in the last 7 years.

Plymouth's business density is considerably lower than the surround areas as well as the national average.

The distribution of economic activity in Plymouth i.e. concentrated around large organisations (HMNB, hospital etc.) makes increasing business density difficult.

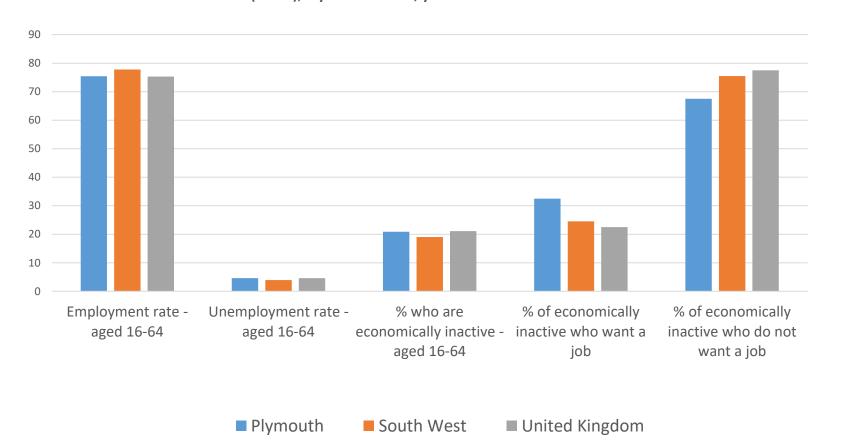
Enterprise Births per 10,000 working age pop.

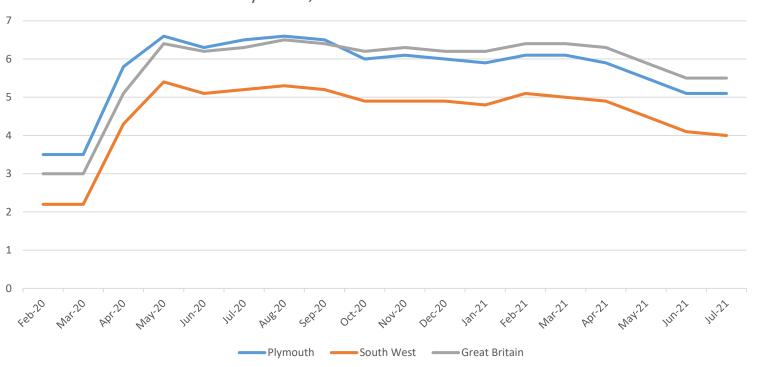
Economic Activity - % of Working Age Population (16-64), Plymouth vs. UK, year-to-Dec 2020

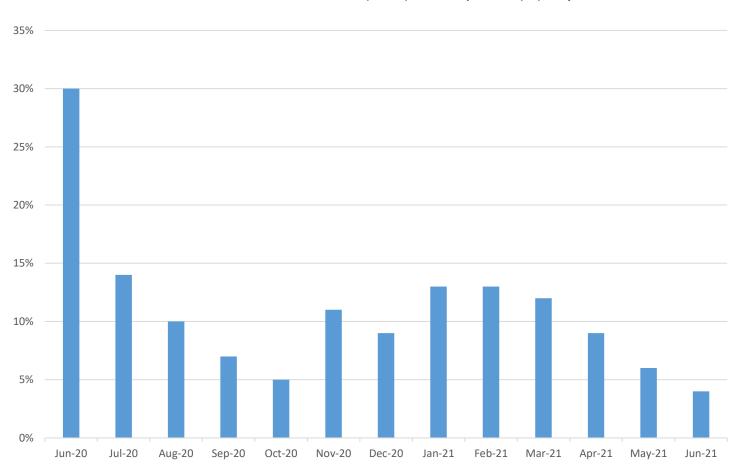
Claimant Count; % of 16-64 resident population claiming, Plymouth, South West & Great Britain

Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme (CJRS) Take-Up Rate (%); Plymouth



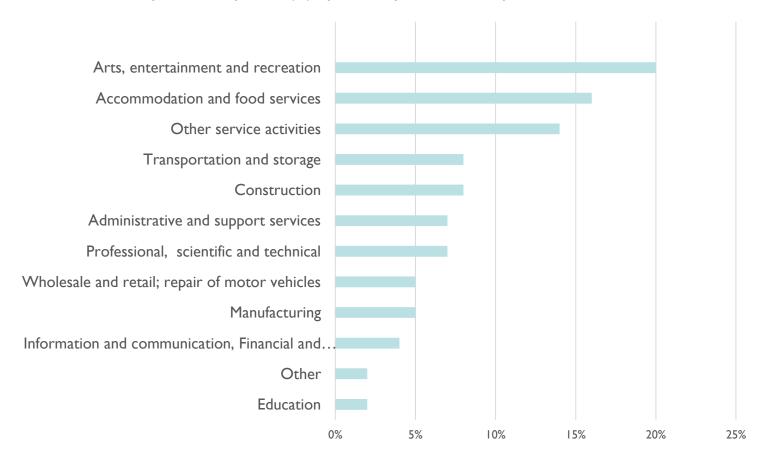

CJRS Take-Up Rate (%) by industry; South West, June 2021

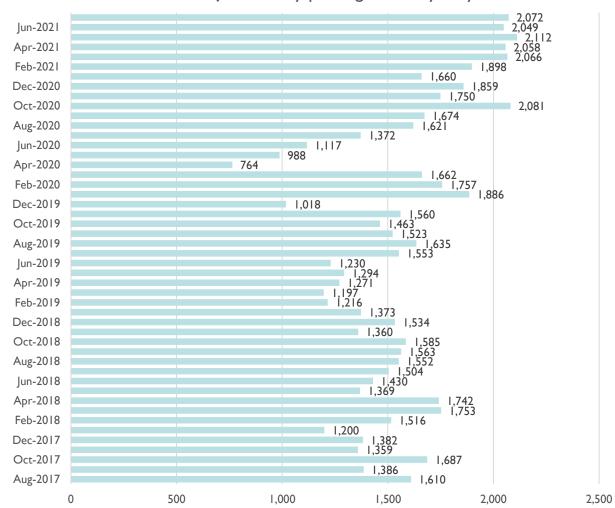

Total number of job vacancy postings monthly - Plymouth

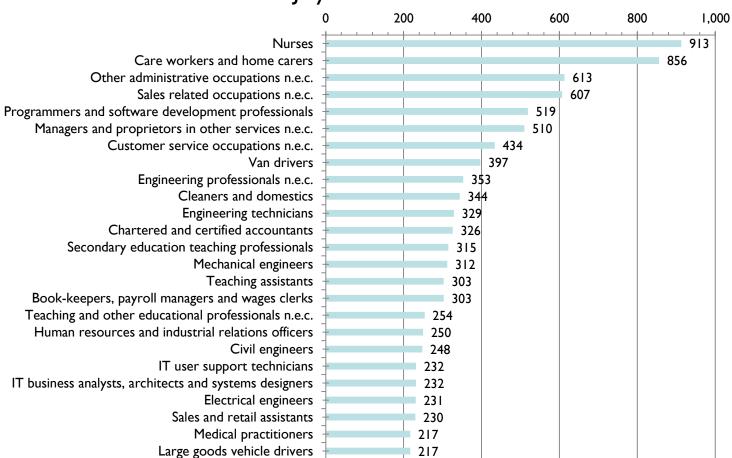

% of 16-64 with no qualifications Plymouth, South West, UK

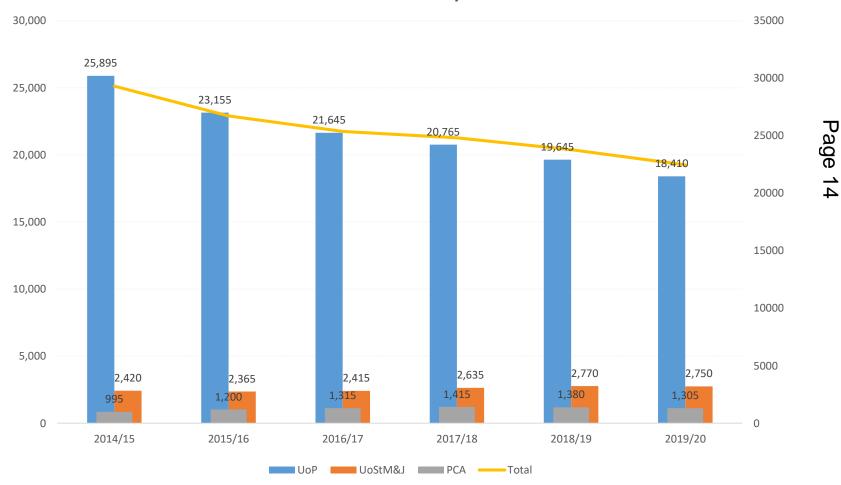

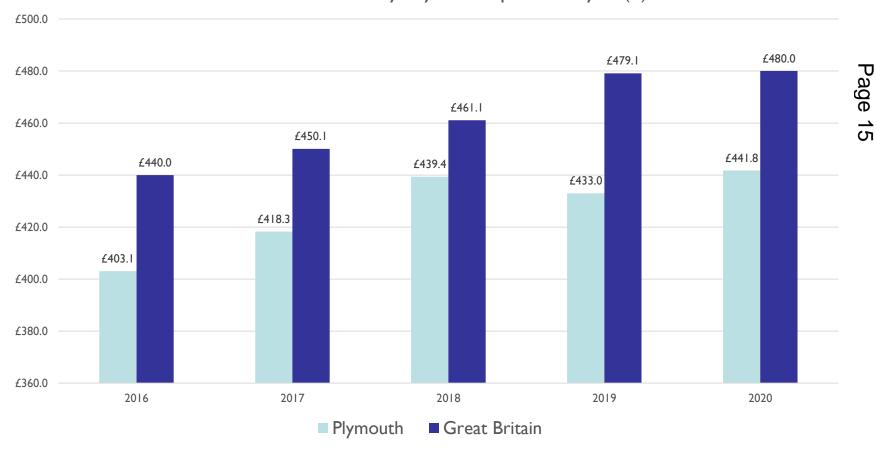
#### **HE Student Enrolments - Plymouth HEIs**
