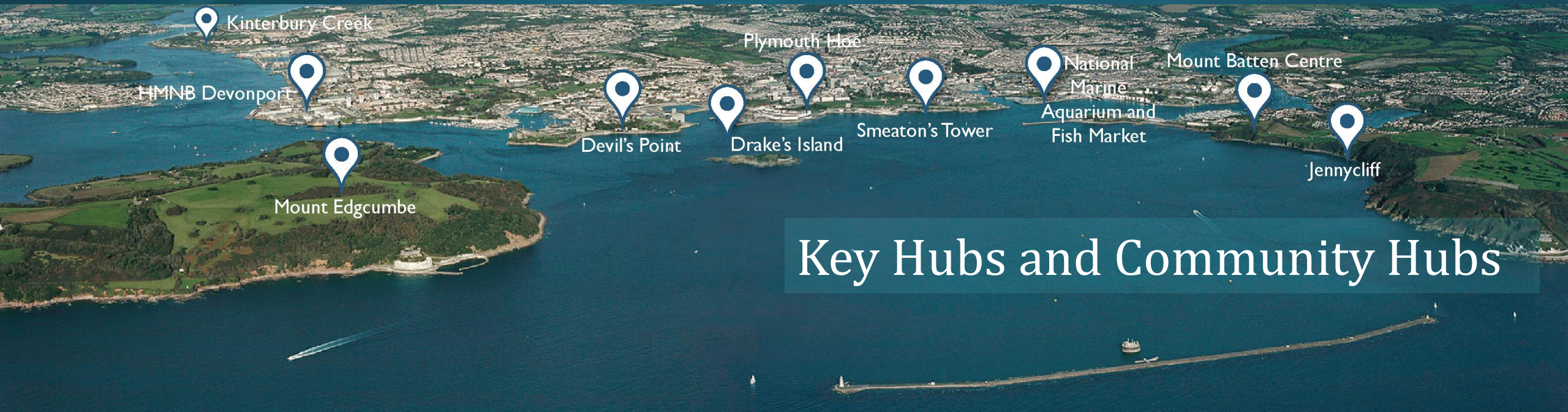

Key Hubs and Community Hubs

National Heritage Lottery Fund Award - NMP

Funding split into two phases:

- 2 year Development Phase 10% of funding to test and trial and develop projects (July 2021 to June 2023)
- 5 year Delivery Phase (following approval)
- Investment in:
 - physical assets,
 - social and engagement programmes
 - and in digital
- 4 Physical Gateway Sites and Digital Gateway
- Community Access Improvements



Tinside Pool and Cove – Health and Wellbeing Hub

- New Contract to run leisure assets – LATC
- Mass participation in swimming and paddling
- Enhancing existing and new facilities for water users
- Commercial activity opportunities



Mount Edgcumbe – Marine Heritage Hub

- Connecting people to their marine history and natural environment
- Heritage conservation, research, education and volunteering
- Refurbishment of the Garden Battery for a Marine Heritage Centre



National Marine Aquarium– Nature and Environment Hub

- Ocean Conservation Trust
- Ocean citizenship education and outreach programmes
- Seagrass and habitat conservation
- Welcome centre for the Plymouth Sound National Marine Park



Mount Batten Peninsular – Recreation Hub,

- Gateway to nature - getting people next to, on, in and under the water
- Landscape improvements including water and beach access
- Reimagining the water sports centre and providing new welcome, toilet and changing facilities.



Digital Park – linking audiences to the wonders of The Sound

- Bringing the National Marine Park to life using cutting edge technology, research and innovation.
- Digital Gateway - utilising existing assets including Smart Sound, The Box and Immersive Dome
