- Ensure that Cabinet members are briefed at the appropriate time on significant issues ie those that may:
- Result in a change to established policy
- Have major resource implications
- Be contentious or politically sensitive

The principles of the allocation of seats to political groups

The four principles to be applied when allocating seats to political groups are:
(a) that not all seats are allocated to the same political group;
(b) that a political group with an overall Council majority gets a majority of seats allocated;
(c) subject to (a) and (b) that the total number of seats each political group has on all ordinary committees is in proportion to that group's total share of the total council elected membership; and
(d) Subject to (a) to (c) that each political group has the same proportion of seats as it holds on the Council as a whole.

The application of those principles is set out below
Principle (a) - The seats will be allocated amongst the Conservative and Labour groups
Principle (b) - As the majority group, the Conservatives will receive the majority of seats

However the Council has previously decided that the seats on the Standards Committee should be allocated on the basis of political balance, at 3 Conservative and 2 Labour Councillors.
