	Delegate to the Strategic Director for Place the authorisation of procurement processes commensurate with the Business Plans for the undertaking as agreed at the council meetings of Plymouth City Council and Cornwall Council.

	Processes to procure a contract is the responsibility of both Plymouth City Council and Cornwall Council. Cornwall Council lead the procurement processes in respect of the undertaking, this delegation will enable the Strategic Director for Place to authorise future procurements to take place. Subsequent contract awards will require an Executive Decision in line with Plymouth City Council governance processes.

	Authorisation to begin procurements remain the responsibility of the Leader / Cabinet.
