1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 On the 30th March 2022 the licensing department received an application from John Gaunt Partners Solicitors on behalf of Hotel Co 51 UK Limited for the Grant of a Premises Licence under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of Moxy Hotel situated at junction of Bath Street and Millbay Road Plymouth.

1.2 Grant application.

This is a development site.

The premises are being developed into a new Hotel which will provide accommodation to guests being open 24 hours per day. In addition to providing the usual accommodation restaurant and bar facilities as would be expected with a hotel with meeting room facilities as detailed on the plans lodged with the application. Also Included in the licensed area is an external licensed area.

The matters of particular note are as follows:-

It is proposed the bar/restaurant/meeting room facilities will be open for licensable activities to Non-residents as follows:

Monday to Sunday 10:00 hours to 01: 00 hours the following morning.

In addition there will be certain extended hours request for Bank Holiday weekends and on other occasions such as New Year's Eve and the Christmas period as detailed in the application.

For residents and their bona fide guests, facilities (Including alcohol) will be available 24 hours a day as detailed.

There will be a request for live music and recorded music, limited Indoor sporting events, pre-recorded films and late night refreshment.

The appropriate drawings deposited with the application are as follows (**Appendix 2**):

Location plan - plan number P22-003-L-00-01/HB/1.

Plan showing the ground licensed area, internal and external and also upper floors being floors 1 to 5 - plan number P22-003-L-00-02/HB/1.

Please further note the appropriate fire safety precautions will be incorporated within the development in consultation with the Fire Officer and under the Building Regulation Approval process.

We do not anticipate the proposed development will adversely affect crime and disorder or public nuisance or any of the other licensing objectives,

It is proposed the development of this site will improve the area by providing jobs for the local community and the new hotel facility for this location.

It is proposed that the property will operate as part of the "Moxy" Hotel which is part of the Marriott brand of hotels.

It is understood that the premises do not fall within a Cumulative Impact Policy area.

1.3 Licensable Activities.

The following licensable activities and timings have been requested:

Monday to Sunday 00:00 – 24:00

Generally will be entertainment on screens **and** t.v. screens and in addition on demand to rooms and for other functions.

New Year's Eve: 10:00 to New Year's Day - terminal hour as proposed

Residents and their bona fide guests will be entitled to be served alcohol **24** hours a day, **7 days a week**

An additional hour at the time of the Saturday into the Sunday of British summertime.

(l) Hours Premises are Open to the Public

The premises are a Hotel which will be open 24 hours a day 7 days a week

4.0 CONSIDERATIONS

4.1 The Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives, which are:

- The prevention of crime and disorder;

- The protection of children from harm.

In making its decision the Committee is also obliged to have regard to:

- the guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 with the following paragraphs relevant to this application: 1.2 – 1.5, 1.16 – 1.17, 2.1,2.3, 2.15 – 2.21, 8.41, 9.3,9.11, 9.33 - 9.36, 9.38 – 9.40 and 10.10,
- The Council's own Licensing Policy with the following headed paragraphs being relevant to this application: Public Nuisance (Page 10 & 19), Licensing hours pages 12 – 13, Licensing conditions (page 22) the representations (including supporting information) presented by all the parties.

The Committee must take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:

1. Grant the licence as asked.
2. Modify the conditions of the licence, by altering or omitting or adding to them.
3. Reject the whole or part of the application.
4. It may also refuse to specify a designated premises supervisor and/or only allow certain requested licensable activities.

The Committee is asked to note that it may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be appropriate in order to promote the licensing objectives.

I have undertaken my own risk assessment to take the following proposed steps.

The steps identified in relation to the four licensing objectives are:-

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed, save as below

1. The use of doorstaff will be risk assessed on an ongoing basis by the licence holder or premises supervisor.
2. Alcoholic and other drinks may not be removed from the premises in open containers save for consumption in any external area provided or in hotel bedrooms.
3. Staff will receive training on matters concerning underage sales, drugs policies, and operating procedures.
4. There shall be a zero tolerance policy in relation to drugs at the premises and there shall be regular checks by management to prevent the use of drugs by patrons. Drugs seized shall be stored securely and handed to the police.
5. A CCTV system shall be fitted to the reasonable satisfaction of the Police with recording facilities. Recordings from the CCTV system shall be retained for a reasonable period and provided to a Police Officer upon reasonable request subject to Data Protection legislation.

c) Public safety

1. The premises will have adequate safety and fire fighting equipment and such equipment will be maintained in good operational order.
2. Staff will be trained on matters of safety, evacuation and use of emergency equipment as required.
3. Spillages and breakages will be removed as soon as possible to reduce the risk to patrons and staff.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

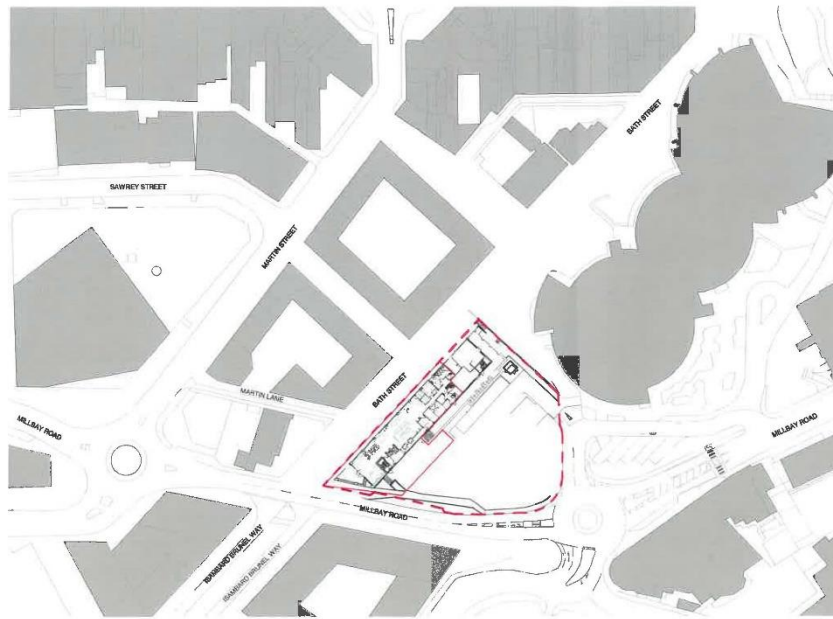
No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed, save as below

1. Where appropriate, prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting the public respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.

e) The protection of children from harm

1. There shall be adequate controls in place including staff training to safeguard against the sale of alcohol to persons under 18 years.
2. Where children are admitted to the premises their presence shall not be inconsistent with the style and operation of the premises at the time and licensable activities that are being carried out.

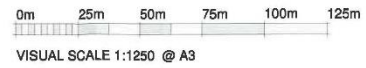
- LICENSED AREA

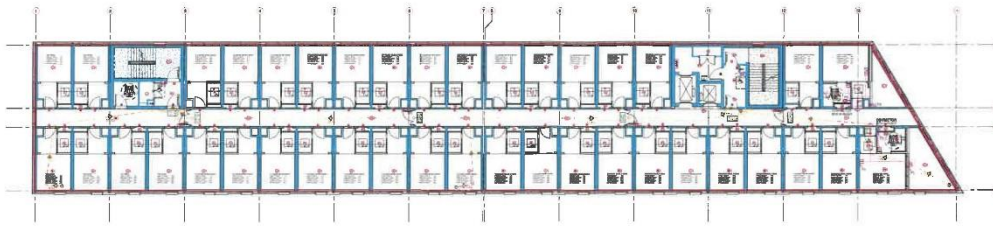

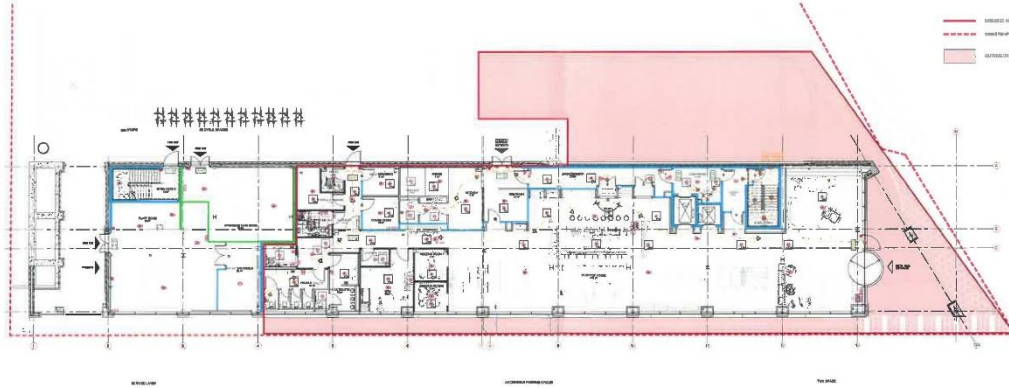

The Prevention of Public Nuisance;

The application is for the service of alcohol 24 hours a day and the provision of regulated entertainment until 1am. The applicant has not agreed any conditions with this department as stipulated in Plymouth City Councils Licensing Policy. The Licensing Policy states that;

“Between the hours of 23:00 and 08:00 hours any new premises licence is expected to include a condition of total sound containment within the licensed premises. Any existing licensed premises that cause disturbance between 23:00 and 08:00 hours are expected to take measures to reduce noise levels so as not to cause a nuisance to local residents.”

Recommendations

I therefore recommend that this application is granted subject to the following conditions being included:

In accordance with Plymouth City Councils Licensing Policy I consider the condition below to be necessary;

1. Between 23:00 and 08:00 there will be total sound containment within the premises.

This condition ensures that any entertainment is at such a level to entertain hotel guests and not have any impact on any surrounding properties or residents. This is in accordance with the licensing objective for The Prevention of Public Nuisance.

The condition is easy to monitor by both the applicant and the enforcing authority in the event of any noise complaints.

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
