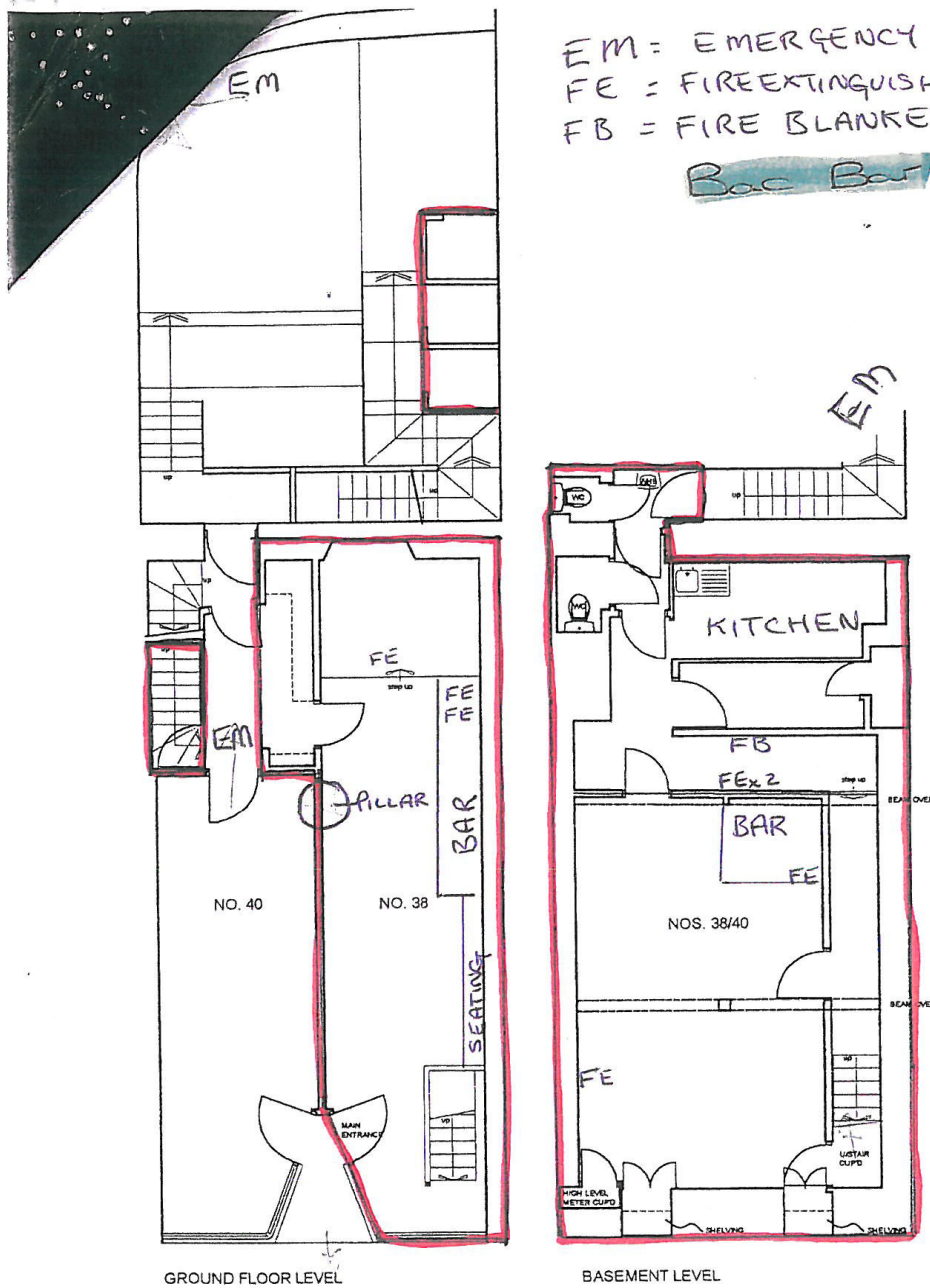

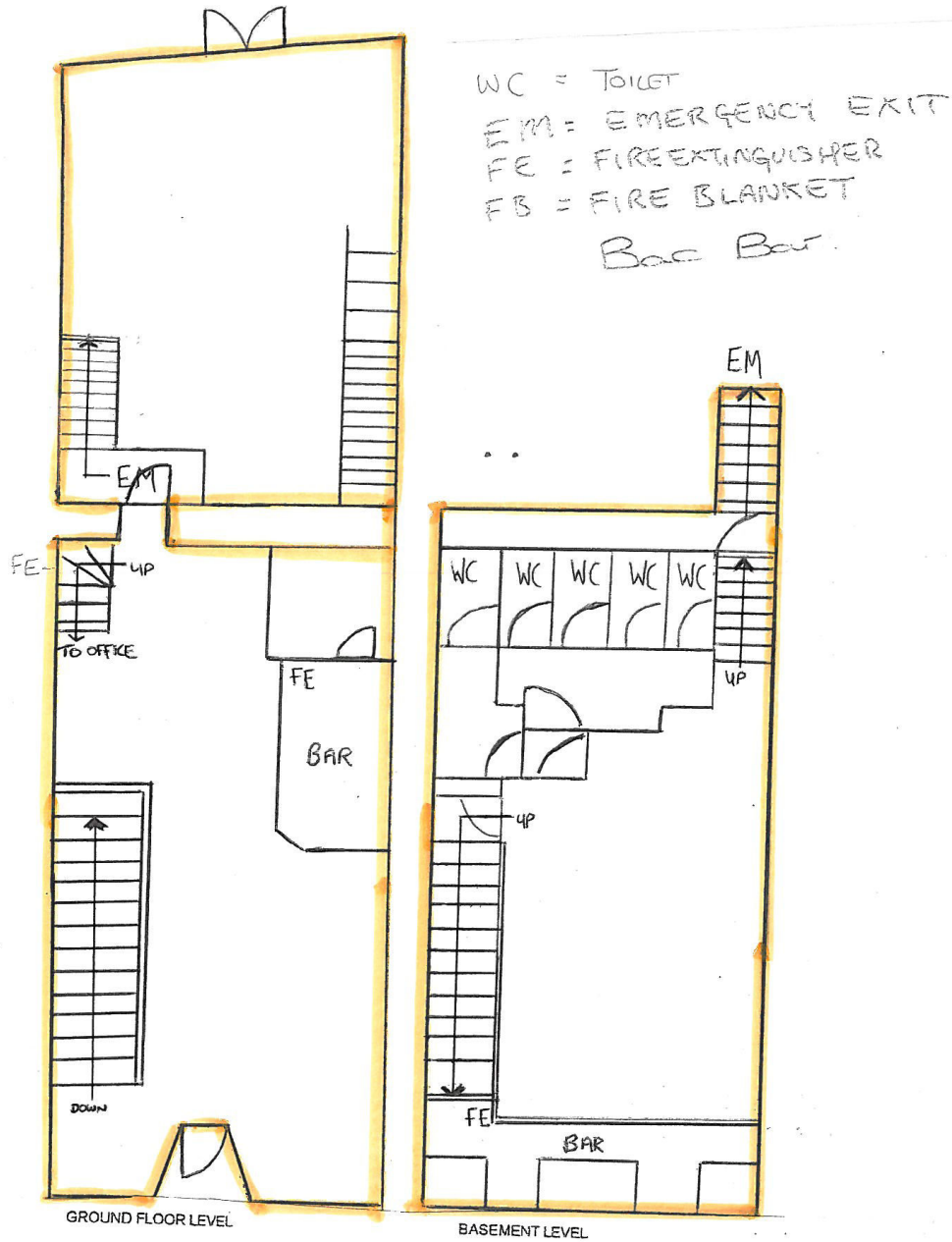

On 23rd July 2010 the Licensing Office at Charles Cross Police Station received a copy of the application to vary the Premises Licence as detailed above.

The Devon and Cornwall Constabulary wish to make representations to the Licensing Committee re this application for the following reasons

The premises are located within a Cumulative Impact Area as defined in Plymouth City Councils licensing policy and we would refer to the evidence produced by police that supported the introduction of this policy.

The policy was adopted in response to the level of Crime disorder and public nuisance reported in the area as a result of the number of licensed premises which remained open until the very early hours.

The police will produce evidence that the area in which the premises are situated is subject to a rising level of crime and anti social behaviour the majority of which occurs between the hours of 1900 and 0600hrs.

The police are unable to link all instances of crime and disorder or public nuisance to particular premises.

The police have examined the application in detail and liaison has taken place with Mr Carter prior to this application.

The police believe the removal of the existing condition B1 barring the use of the outside area (as defined on the plans held by Plymouth City Council) after 2330hrs

and the application to allow it to be used for licensable activity until 0400hrs currently does not demonstrate how the variation will not have an impact on the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety or the prevention of public nuisance

Both the Licensing act and the Plymouth City Council Licensing policy require any application for a material variation within a cumulative impact area to demonstrate how the applicant intends to ensure that the variation will not impact on the promotion of the four licensing objectives.

This department has made representation based on the following information.

The proposed application requests the removal of current licence condition B1 of Licence reference PA0158, and includes the revocation of recorded music outdoors and inclusion of CCTV system. The condition stipulates no outdoor use after 23:30hrs.

The premises are situated within a cumulative impact area. The special policy was adopted due to the overall levels of crime, disorder and nuisance that was prevalent in the area resulting from licensed premises which continue operating until the early hours of the morning which cannot be linked to a particular premises. With particular regard to the anti-social behaviour and nuisance behaviour of patrons leaving licensed premises and their impact on the surrounding neighbourhood in the early hours of the morning.

Responses from residents concerning the adoption of the special policy, strongly commented on how alcohol-related anti social behaviour and disturbance associated with the large numbers of patrons present in the vicinity of North Hill impacted on local residents. No representations were received from licensed premises operating in the area at the time of the consultation. Only one commercial property commented on the level of crime, but did not want to restrict commercial activity as a result.

The number of licensed premises in North Hill and surrounding areas remains high, largely consisting of vertical late night drinking establishments which predominantly focus on the student market, as it has done historically.

North Hill area of Plymouth continues to attract large numbers of people and remains busy beyond 6am on occasions, although this impact is reduced during period June to September when the University is closed. The North Hill and surrounding areas of Mutley Plain and Greenbank has a mixed residential and commercial use, serving a variety of domestic situations from student accommodation to residential homes.

The Cumulative impact policy was adopted to control various forms of and potential for alcohol-related public nuisance. In particular the operating schedule provided by the applicant fails to acknowledge the potential affect of noise from the use of the outside areas beyond 23:30hrs until close of business at 4am would have: and what measures would be taken to mitigate its affects on and off the premises.

This Department has been made aware of issues and have received complaints concerning a variety of nuisances in North Hill and surrounding areas.

Both businesses and residents living in the vicinity (including above the various premises) are likely to be affected by the proposed application. It is also of concern that people living in the vicinity of the North Hill, Mutley and Greenbank areas will also be further inconvenienced by noise from large numbers of patrons moving between; venues, food businesses, ATMs, taxi stands, and again when travelling home.

Residents of Mutley, North Hill and Greenbank have already raised complaints over the numbers of people returning home during early hours of the morning, citing complaints of; noise from people shouting and singing, vomit and food waste littering the streets, taxis engines idling, violence, and other incidents of crime and disorder such as fighting which has not been directly attributed to any specific licensed premises. The cumulative impact policy was put in place to mitigate these effects where there is a concentration of licensed premises.

This Department participated in 'Week of Action' between 14th and 16th May 2009 as part of a joint operation with the Police. This was in response to continued concerns of residents living in the North Hill and Greenbank areas. At this time it was noted that there was a high number of people moving through residential areas causing low level nuisance and anti-social behaviour, which was not attributed to any particular premises. The Police identified that noise from music reduced significantly after 3am.

The applicant has not demonstrated within the operating schedule submitted with the application how there will be no negative cumulative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives. The operating schedule fails to address how the potential impact from increased use of the outside area will be reasonably controlled to prevent any cumulative impact and noise creep from patrons using the area up to 4am.

The current terminal hours for licensable activities at these premises contribute towards a staggered dispersal scheme, reducing the potential impact of persons under drink leaving the vicinity during the early hours of the morning. The current restriction on the use of outside areas is also consistent with the principles of the dispersal scheme and work to reduce excess noise leading into the night-time (between 23:00 and 07:00hrs) periods where people living in the vicinity are more likely to be disturbed.

I can also confirm that a complaint was recently received (16 December 2009) concerning noise from this licensed premises alleging noise disturbance from both music provided at the venue, and from patrons making noise when using the smoking area late at night.

The potential effect of increased noise activity from extending the use of the outdoor area will in the opinion of this Department contribute further to cumulative impact on the local community. Taking this information into consideration, it is the recommendation of this Authority that the application to amend condition B1 is refused.

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
