#### 1.0 BACKGROUND

1.1 On the 14<sup>th</sup> April 2011 the licensing department received an application from Gill Akaster Solicitors on behalf of Mr Vahid Babolhavaeji for the Grant of a Premises Licence under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of Premiere Bar & Grill (previously known as Stop by Takeaway) situated at 429A Crownhill Road, West Park, Plymouth.

#### 1.2 Grant application.

#### 4.0 CONSIDERATIONS


- 4.1 The Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives, which are:
  - the prevention of crime and disorder;
  - public safety;
  - the prevention of public nuisance;
  - the protection of children from harm.

In making its decision the Committee is also obliged to have regard to the guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Council's own Licensing Policy and the representations (including supporting information) presented by all the parties.

The Committee must take such of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives:

- 1. Grant the licence as asked.
- 2. Modify the conditions of the licence, by altering or omitting or adding to them.
- 3. Reject the whole or part of the application.
- 4. It may also refuse to specify a designated premises supervisor and/or only allow certain requested licensable activities.

The Committee is asked to note that it may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be necessary in order to promote the licensing objectives.



#### **Public Nuisance:**

- 1. No tables to be allocated to customers after 21.00hrs in the outside area, and the outside area must be cleared by 22.30.
- 2. The outside area may be used as a designated smoking area only after 22.30

(This will allow provision of a smoking area on the premises but will discourage potential public nuisance.)

- 3. No outdoor furniture shall be used after 22.30hrs
  (This is to discourage patrons from congregating in the outside area after this time)
- 4. The supply of alcohol externally shall be by waiter or waitress service only and ancillary to the consumption of a substantial meal.
- 5. Management will control levels of noise in the outside area and advise customers of the need to respect local residents where appropriate. Any patrons continuing to cause any disturbance or disorder will be asked to leave the premises
- 6. After 22.30 the outside area must be supervised by staff to ensure patrons do not congregate. Staff must ensure that patrons disperse back into the venue after smoking to prevent disturbance to neighbouring residential accommodation.

# Licensing Act 2003 Supporting Information for Committee Hearing following the Public Protection Service Representation

Premises Name: Premiere Bar and Grill (formerly Stop-by Takeaway)

It is this Responsible Authority's opinion that, having considered the applicants operating schedule if the application were to be granted as applied, then there is potential for a negative impact on the licensing objective of public nuisance.

The Premises is located close to residential properties and local amenities (that do not include licensed premises). The outside area of the premises if granted as applied has the potential to cause a public nuisance to local residents. The outside of the premises faces a row of residential dwellings across Crownhill Road, when traffic flow along this road naturally diminishes later in the evening, so naturally do background noise levels, as such the potential for patrons in the outside area causing a public nuisance and affecting local residents is increased.

The conditions put forward to control the potential impact on public nuisance are in this Responsible Authority's opinion both workable and reasonable.
