29. CHAIR'S URGENT BUSINESS

There were no items of Chair's urgent business.

30. STREET TRADING REPORT 2014/15

Emily Bullimore (BID Street Operations and Street Trading Manager) provided Members with the Street Trading report 2014/15.

Members were advised that -

- (a) current licenses were due to expire on 31 March 2014 and it was proposed that the city centre consents and all hoe ice cream sites (vans) commence on Tuesday I April 2014 and end on Tuesday 31 March 2015;
- (b) consent fees were not adjusted in 2013/2014 however it was proposed that the consent fees for 2014/2015 were increased by 1.5% to cover the electricity connection costs for the pitches and maintenance works to be carried out;
- (c) the report was required to be presented to the Committee to give officers the authority to advertise the pitches under the Miscellaneous Provision Act; consents were only issued for a maximum of 12 months and ice cream consent applications would be considered by the Licensing Sub Committee;

In response to questions raised it was reported that -

- (d) the BID Street Operations and Street Trading Manager would be responsible for covering operations in the city centre; licensing information upon the City's Market Charter would still be issued to the Licensing Committee;
- (e) there were access issues concerning the pitches on the Hoe (not relating to ice cream vendors) therefore those specific sites were still vacant; an update on this issue would be provided to Members via email;
- (f) it was the intention of the Council to take back responsibility for the electric payments for the pitches; this would ensure that the electricity points for each pitch were fully functioning and regularly maintained. Vendors would be billed for their use of electric;
- (g) traders would sign up for a 12 month licence and would be billed quarterly by the Council for their electricity use; this would enable the Council to put provisions in place to retrieve money from traders who had not paid whilst they were still under licence with the Council;
- (h) the BID Street Operations and Street Trading Manager was due to meet with a representative from a electricity company in order to discuss arrangements for billing traders; it was considered that, when events were taking place in the city and an electricity hook-up was required a reading would be taken from the electricity point on the morning of the event so that traders would be billed for exactly what they had used; Traders would be asked to sign to agree that the reading was correct;
- (i) charity money collectors were not the responsibility of the BID Street Operations and Street Trading Manager, these licenses were the responsibility of the licensing team and public protection service;

Purpose of the report:

Licensing Committee is asked to consider an application submitted by the Devon and Cornwall Police, to make a Designated Public Places Order (DPPO) to cover Marlborough St and the surrounding area within Devonport. This report seeks Committee approval to proceed to the public consultation stage, after which a further report will be prepared for Committee to decide whether there is sufficient evidence to justify the making an order.

Local Authorities were given powers under Section 13 of the Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001 (as amended by Section 26 of the Violent Crime Reduction Act 2006) to designate an area where nuisance, annoyance or disorder, is arising from consuming alcohol in public places.

The prescribed procedure on how to implement a DPPO is set out in the Local Authorities (Alcohol Consumption in Designated Public Places) Regulations 2007.

The applicant will attend the Committee hearing to present the application and to answer any questions.

The Brilliant Co-Operative Council Corporate Plan 2013/14 - 2016/17

This report links to the delivery of the City and Council priorities. In particular:

Growing Plymouth: The order would provide the police with the necessary tools provide a proactive response to street drinking and the effects that it can have on the surrounding neighbourhood in terms of anti-social behaviour and nuisance. This in turn will have positive outcomes of encouraging residents to use public spaces and the surrounding commercial outlets.

Caring Plymouth: The order will allow for the effective control of potential alcohol-related antisocial behaviour or public nuisance related offences before they become a problem and if granted,

would support the 'Strategic Alcohol Plan for Plymouth 2013-2018'.

Implications for Medium Term Financial Plan and Resource Implications: Including finance, human, IT and land

If the Committee consider sufficient evidence has been submitted the Council has a duty to undertake a wider public consultation. Resources would be required to run the consultation process and there are also financial implications in relation to advertising of the proposals and if approved the preparation of signs to be placed throughout the designated area.

The applicant has secured funding from a variety of local sources to cover the costs of advertising, public consultation costs, printing costs and purchase of signage (if the application is approved). It is anticipated that these costs will be in the region of £4.5K.

Officer time required to facilitate a consultation process, in conjunction with the applicant would be absorbed within existing budgets.

Other Implications: e.g. Child Poverty, Community Safety, Health and Safety, Risk Management:

Members should be aware that Section 17 of the Crime Disorder Act 1998 put a statutory duty on every Local Authority to exercise its various functions with due regard to the need to do all that it reasonably can do to prevent crime and disorder in its area.

This application is designed to improve community safety by reducing crime and the fear of crime from street drinking

Recommendations and Reasons for recommended action:

- I. That Committee consider the evidence submitted and decide whether there is sufficient evidence, that nuisance, annoyance or disorder is caused to members of the public or a section of the public, which are associated with the consumption of alcohol in the area outlined in Appendix 2
- 2. Members determine whether to authorise the Public Protection Service to facilitate the public consultation in the specified area, as prescribed by the Local Authorities (Alcohol Consumption in Designated Public Places) Regulations 2007, and then report back detailing the results of that consultation in order that Committee can consider whether or not to approve the granting of the Designated Public Place Order.

Reason

When an application for the grant of a DPPO is received the Council is under a duty to consider the application. In order to facilitate the grant of a DPPO it is legally necessary to undertake a public consultation.

Alternative options considered and rejected:

To not approve a public consultation would mean that the powers specified within a DPPO could not be applied and existing enforcement options would have to be used to try a manage street drinking in this specified area.

To utilise new powers available under the Anti-Social, Crime and Policing Act 2014 which replaces some of the existing framework for tackling anti-social behaviour and environmental nuisance. A DPPO will be replaced by a Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO). It is anticipated that the new provision are likely to be effective from October 2014. Any exisiting DPPO will continue to be in force for a period of 3 years. Any benefit gained in a reduction of consultation costs is outweighed by the delay and the continuation of problems associated with street drinking.

I.0 BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001 introduced a provision for Local Authorities to designate public places in which it becomes an offence for a person to carry on drinking alcohol when they have been requested to stop by a police officer. Powers of confiscation of alcohol (or anything which the officer believes to be alcohol) also apply to such areas.
- I.2 Before the police can invoke these powers the Council must, under Section I3 of the Criminal Justice and Public Order Act 2001, make an order (Designated Public Places Order (DPPO) that the land is a public place to which the new legislation applies.
- 1.3 An order can only be made if the Council is satisfied that there is nuisance and annoyance to members of the public in a particular area, which is associated with the consumption of alcohol. Local Authorities are required to make an assessment based on the evidence submitted concerning the level of anti-social drinking and disorder before proceeding.

2.0 THE PROPOSAL

2.1 The Council have received an application from Devon and Cornwall Police to create a new DPPO, which would encompass Marlborough St and surrounding areas within Devonport to manage the potential consequences of displacement. The application, including statistical and community evidence is contained in Appendix 1. The map of the specified area has been extracted from the application and is marked Appendix 2. Letters of support from local Ward Councillors are included and marked as Appendix 3.

The application has identified the following main points;

- 2.2 There has been an on-going problem concerning anti-social behaviour and disorder associated with 'street drinking' focused on the pedestrian area of Marlborough Street. The main problems relate to drunkenness, aggressive behaviour, disorderly behaviour, urination, and littering.
- 2.3 The police have contributed proactively to numerous multi-agency problem solving initiatives with Plymouth City Council partners including:
 - Salvation Army
 - Plymouth Access to Housing (PATH)
 - Anti-Social Behaviour Team
 - Housing Associations
 - Local Business
 - Community Engagement
 - Police Licensing Team
- 2.4 None of these initiatives have effectively addressed the existing problem of street drinking in this area and how it contributes to nuisance and disturbance, in a proactive and effective way. Currently without a DPPO police officers are playing 'catch-up' and are unable to act until public order offences arise as a consequence. A DPPO would allow a proactive, preventative approach to be taken.
- 2.5 Many of the incidences are not criminal offences. Individuals openly consume alcohol, are characteristically loud at times, fall asleep, occupy benches, intimidate by their numbers and appearance and generally take over defined areas. This makes it difficult for a police officer

- to address the route-causes before circumstances escalate to the point where offences occur and action can be taken causing a continuing frustration to residents and passers-by.
- 2.6 A DPPO would allow officers to remove the alcohol element, which fuels this behaviour and prevent escalation towards criminal behaviour. In addition the introduction of an order will demonstrate to habitual street drinkers that this conduct is no longer tenable.
- 2.7 The DPPO would also encourage licensees to responsibly retail through the restricted availability of high strength cheap alcohol.

3.0 POINTS FOR CONSIDERATION

- 3.1 The introduction of a DPPO does not impose a total ban on drinking alcohol in public places but does make it an offence to carry on drinking when asked to stop by a police officer. The order would therefore be used to tackle anti-social drinking.
- 3.2 The Police already have powers under the Confiscation of Alcohol (Young Persons) Act 1997 to confiscate alcohol from any person who is under 18 and dispose of that alcohol in an appropriate manner. In addition, from any person where a police officer reasonably suspects that they intend to supply a person under 18.
- 3.3 The Police also have powers under Section 6-8 of the Violent Crime Reduction Act 2006 to apply for a Drinking Banning Order in situations where an individual of at least 16 years of age has engaged in criminal or disorderly conduct while under the influence of alcohol and a court considers that such an order is necessary to protect the public.
- 3.4 Existing premises or areas licensed under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 are exempted. Also where a Temporary Events Notice (TEN) is granted for a festival or occasion to permit the sale and supply of alcohol, the event would be excluded from the provisions of the DPPO for the duration of the event, together with a period of 30 minutes following the completion of the event.
- 3.5 The Anti-Social, Crime and Policing Act 2014 has just received royal ascent and seeks to streamline and replace some of the existing framework for tackling anti-social behaviour and environmental nuisance. The new powers replace DPPO's with a Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO) but at the time of writing officers have no information as to an implementation date, although it is anticipated to be October 2014.
 - The PSPO is a more flexible and less costly method that can be used for dealing with antisocial behaviour in public spaces and can be applied to street drinking, dog fouling, littering, graffiti and similar activities. The Council must be satisfied that a particular activity has a detrimental effect on the quality of life of those in that locality.
 - It is likely that further statutory guidance will be issued in due course that will outline how a PSPO will be applied.
- 3.6 Following the implementation of PSPO's, existing DPPO's can remain in replace for a 3 year period, after which time a review must be carried out, if grounds still remain for retaining the order, then it would then be re-designated as a PSPO. ADPPO must, however, have been formally ratified before the implementation date of the new PSPO procedures.
 - The Act will extend powers to enforce a DPPO / PSPO to Council Officers and PCSOs.
- 3.7 Funds to cover the costs of advertising, printing costs and purchase of signage (if the application were approved) are estimated at £4.5K and will be funded by a variety of external sources including the police and local community groups.
 - Officer time required to facilitate the consultation process in conjunction with the

- applicant would be absorbed within existing budgets.
- 3.8 The question of displacement is an important matter for consideration. The introduction of a DPPO can have the effect of moving street drinking on to neighbouring areas that are not designated. This effect may justify a larger area being designated than solely the identified hot spot.

4.0 CONCLUSIONS

- 4.1 The Committee must decide whether there are suitable grounds to commence a consultation before the introduction of the new PSPO provisions which may be implemented later this year. Where the Committee consider there are reasonable grounds to proceed with the DPPO application they must be satisfied that the information submitted in the application and any additional information submitted during the hearing, has established that there is an existing problem associated with the consumption of alcohol, which exposes local residents to anti-social behaviour that would warrant initiating a public consultation.
- 4.2 The Committee must also be satisfied that there is sufficient evidence to warrant the extent of the application area as set out in Appendix 2.
- 4.3 If a public consultation is approved, Officers will then facilitate the public consultation with the applicant to comply with the statutory provisions and report back the results for Committee to decide whether or not to approve the application for the grant of a DPPO.

I am Chief Superintendent Andrew Boulting the senior Police Commander for the Plymouth policing area which provides policing services to the communities' subject of this Designated Public Place Order (DPPO) application. This is covered by the Plymouth unitary Local Authority.

I have considered the nature, weight and volume of information provided in support of this application and the requirements under section 13 of the Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001 and section 26 of the Violent Crime Reduction Act 2006. In addition I have taken into account the Home Office guidance for local authorities on DPPO's dated December 2008.

The information provided gives me strong cause to believe that the geographical areas subject of the application (the neighbourhoods of Stoke, Devonport and Mount Wise) are currently suffering from alcohol related disorder and nuisance and will either continue to do so unless the powers under a DPPO are adopted or will suffer increased alcohol related disorder as a result of displacement if a limited DPPO order is applied across a smaller geographical area.

The evidence presented is drawn from a wide range of sources including information provided by members of the Crime and Disorder Reduction Partnership, local businesses, housing associations, community meetings, police crime and incident report data and local residents. The evidence clearly describes the prevalence of alcohol related crime, disorder and nuisance related directly to the issue of street drinking. It is my belief that the previous implementation and application of more traditional policing and partnership methodologies to reduce the alcohol related disorder and nuisance to create a safer environment there has experienced very limited success and the use of a DPPO is now necessary and proportionate to remedy the problem.

I believe that the risk of displacement has been addressed in the application and the application is supported by the strategic direction set within the Plymouth Strategic Assessment and within the Plymouth strategic alcohol plan which is being monitored through the Health and Well Being Board. As Police Commander for the area affected I am confident that if the order is granted then sufficient resource will be available to monitor it and can confirm that the police have sufficient resources to enforce the order.

I am very supportive of this application and as Police Commander recommend it for progression and adoption of a designation order under section 13 of the Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001.

<u>Designated Public Places Order (DPPO) application for Stoke, Devonport and Mountwise</u>

This application relates to the area of Stoke, Devonport and Mountwise, as outlined on Map 1 within Appendix A.

Background to the Application

The communities of Stoke, Devonport and Mountwise all suffer from increased crime, anti-social behaviour and suffer degradation in their quality of life as a direct result of alcohol related disorder and nuisance. A primary cause of this is the current prevalence of street drinkers and the issues surrounding street drinking, such as fighting, litter, urinating and defecating in public, shouting and swearing at members of the public, people unconscious in the street.

Stoke

Stoke consists of an area of residential homes, two secondary schools, two primary schools. Stoke Village consists of various shops and public houses which are visited by members of the public. Within Stoke there are several parks and green spaces, a community centre, doctor's surgeries, a library and churches.

Devonport

Devonport has recently been through a massive regeneration process and big improvements to resident's quality of living and housing have been made. Devonport Technical College, a Police Station, Community Halls, a Theatre, Brickfield Sports Centre, Plymouth Albion RFC, the Cumberland Medical Centre, Devonport Park, a Shopping Precinct, Salvation Army Housing, Cafes, Parks, the Torpoint Ferry Terminal, a Church, a Library and a Bingo Hall. Devonport is regularly visited by non residents to access these facilities. Devonport Park is used for community events, children to play, sporting activities, dog walking and is a historical place where people like to visit. The South West Coastal Path also runs through both Devonport and Mountwise which is visited by walkers, children on school trips etc.

<u>Mountwise</u>

Mountwise consists mainly of residential dwellings. There is also a primary school, a public swimming pool, two gyms, multiple cafes, various shops, community hall, rehabilitation centre, a youth centre, several boat yards and marinas, industrial premises, a guildhall and various historic attractions which are regularly visited by members of the public.

Over the past three years, all three areas have seen a marked increase in street drinkers and anti-social behaviour.

The parks and green spaces are a magnet for the street drinkers to go and congregate as these areas have places to sit where they can drink and share their

alcohol. The street drinkers can be found at anytime throughout the day but predominately between 0600 to late evening.

The group's sizes of street drinkers range from two to ten people at a time, all of which are alcohol dependent. When speaking with them, they do understand that their behaviour and public perception makes people feel intimidated and scared to walk past them, when they are moved on, they simply move to another area where they will be moved on from again. This is a cycle which cannot be broken.

Many of the street drinkers reside within the Salvation Army Life House which houses homeless people, many of which are drug or alcohol dependent. The staff work very well with the Police and residents and do support the application for a DPPO. Over the past few years the staff have worked with the Police and local shops to deter their residents from drinking in the local vicinity, which has worked with some residents. The street drinkers are offered rehabilitation and support through the Salvation Army.

The persistent offenders are shown in Appendix B.

Mountwise and Stoke have been included in this application to prevent displacement from Devonport into these areas.

During the dispersal order which ran between 21st October 2011 to April 2012, ASB calls made to the Police were lower than the same period the previous year. Once the dispersal order finished the number of ASB calls linked to street drinkers increased again. When asked to move on, once the dispersal order had finished the street drinkers stated, "There is nothing you can do as there is no dispersal order anymore".

The evaluation of our latest Dispersal Order is shown in Appendix C.

A DPPO gives the Police powers to tackle anti-social drinking. The problem of enforcement without a DPPO is that officers have to wait for the street drinker's level of ASB to reach an unacceptable level before effective action can be taken.

It should be noted that although we do have numerous street drinkers, many of them are not committing criminal offences. The individuals will openly drink, be loud, fall asleep or unconscious, occupy seats and benches and intimidate by numbers. This makes it very difficult for the Police to take action, often to the frustration of the community who see this as the Police, "Not doing anything and walking by" and turning a blind eye to the ongoing issues.

The types of report that the Police receive in relation to ASB and street drinking include:

- Urinating and defecating in the street in view of the public.
- Verbal abuse to each other and the public.
- Indecent exposure

A DPPO for these areas would enable the Police to remove the alcohol at an early stage. This would prevent the escalation of the street drinker's behaviour. The community, including the street drinkers are aware of a DPPO and how it can be enforced and used in the area to reduce the anti-social drinking that occurs on a daily basis. The street drinkers are fully aware that an application for a DPPO is being submitted, some of them are in favour of it as they feel it will help them in their rehabilitation.

A DPPO will increase community's confidence in the Police and Local Authority, as they will see the Police effectively dealing with the street drinkers. Anti-social drinking is something that is always mentioned at local community meetings and general conversations with members of the public and shop keepers.

Over the past three years, the Neighbourhood teams have worked with partner agencies to gather the evidence that is included in this report, in order to show the extent of the anti-social behaviour within the three areas in relation to alcohol misuse. It is the vision of the neighbourhood team that visitors and residents to the area are able to visit the area without the fear of being intimidated by street drinkers.

Police Evidence to Support the Application

Anti-social behaviour in relation to street drinking has been documented by the Devonport Neighbourhood Team since January 2005 to June 2012. Please see Appendix D.

All police logs related to street drinking and alcohol related ASB are recorded in **Appendix E**.

Appendix E is a table showing alcohol related ASB logs called into the Police between June 2012 to December 2013.

Community Evidence to Support the Application

The profound effect that the anti-social behaviour has upon the residents and members of the community is evident from the feedback that the neighbourhood team have received (please see appendix F - O).

There are numerous ways that the information has been gained.

- Petitions from housing associations
- Newspaper article
- OP Vocal
- Have Your Say meetings
- Letters and emails from members of the public

Residents, employees, businesses and councillors from all three areas are in support of a DPPO.

Endorsement from 2nd Line Supervisor – Inspector Harris

I have been kept closely up to date with this application by the Neighbourhood Team. I fully support this application owing to ongoing problems with anti-social drinking as it is by far the major issue for the residents, members of the public and the wider community within the Devonport, Mountwise and Stoke areas.

Despite the efforts of the Neighbourhood Team to closely monitor and control the situation, these individuals have continued to cause problems. This is mainly due to lack of Police powers to move them on at an early stage before they become a problem and start committing criminal offences.

By this stage it is too late and the wider community have been adversely affected.

The Neighbourhood Team are fully aware that this is a discretionary power and it will only be used when absolutely necessary.

We have a duty to support the wider community who live, work and visit the area. All these activities at times area being spoilt by the behaviour of the few individuals who have refused help from the police and various partner agencies. I feel that this order is the only way forward as everything else has been tried and failed to solve the problem.

REPORT FOR EVALUATION OF THE DISPERAL ORDER

Following the Dispersal Order finishing, there have been noticeable increases in the number of logs which have been called in, especially in relation to ASB which is directly linked to street drinkers.

During the dispersal order, which ran from 21st October 2011 until 20th April 2012, the number of ASB incidents that occurred within the area decreased a considerable amount. Now this is finished, the number of incidents have increased, with even some of the people who are causing the ASB have stated, when asked to move on from the area 'there is no dispersal area so there is nothing you can do'.

During the Dispersal Order, people were dispersed 25 times. There was noticeable the same offenders who were being given directions to leave the area, also youths who were causing ASB in the area.

Since the Order has finished, there have numerous logs which are called in daily in relation to ASB in the area, mainly around Marlborough Street Granby Way, Marlborough Row and also in the Stoke area, mainly Albert Road.

The main topic of these calls are people drinking alcohol in the street, which in turn causes ASB in the way of foul language, fighting in the street, urinating, exposing themselves, abusive language towards members of the public and Police Officers, unconscious or asleep on the pavement etc.

This report is to show that the Dispersal Order has worked due to least amount of logs which have been created compared to now where there is no Order.

To sum up the above, there have been 30 logs called in by members of the public within the space of 2 and half months which were related to ASB and alcohol related logs.

There are several factors as to why where have been no logs between the dates of 23rd June to present, these being the following:-

- Due to their being a new logging system introduced to the force, not so many ASB logs have been created
- The weather in the past week has been constant rain, which seems to be a
 factor to the people who drink in the street as they then go and search for
 cover hence then not drinking on the streets
- The Salvation Army has began to work very closely with the police and has begun to issue warnings against the people found drinking on the street in the area (that they will lose their bed/room within the hostel) and a few of the problematic street drinkers have already been ejected from the Salvation Army hence them moving out of the area.
- There is also the fact that residents and businesses have use of the officer number hence we get regular calls to move people in drink on however these are not recorded as a log
- PCSO's also come across people drinking in the street on a daily basis and again this is not recorded in any format.

This is what I have managed to get in the time we have.

Devonport neighbourhood

2013/14 year (estimate based on latest data) - Total crime rate is 177 crimes per 1,000 population. This is over twice the crime rate of the whole of Plymouth City (BCU) which is 73 crimes per 1,000 population.

2013/14 year – total crime has increased by 23% on 2012/13. This is compared to Plymouth City (BCU) which has increased by only 1%. Total crime in Devonport n'hood is approx. 902, highest level for 5 years.

2013/14 year — Violence against the person (violence with injury and violence without injury) crimes have increased by 32% on 2012/13 and at 246 offences in 2013/14 is highest level for 5 years.

2013/14 year – Public order offences have increased by 48% on 2012/13 and at 96 offences in 2013/14 is highest level for 5 years.

2013/14 year — ASB levels have increased by 20% on 2012/13 whereas Plymouth City (BCU) has seen small decrease of 1%. Devonport ASB rate is 114 per 1,000 population, almost 3 times the City (BCU) rate of 40 ASB per 1,000 population.

The main point of concern was who would assume the duty of care for an individual who falls into the 'grey' area of being heavily under the influence but not in need of a custody cell or an ambulance.

An action plan has been agreed between the local policing team and Life House staff to put the following to trial for any resident of the Life House who is found in a drunk state and is likely to come to harm if left on the street:

"If there are offences, police will deal in the usual way.

"If subject is unable to walk or function in an adequate way, assess ment for medical assistance will be carried out.

"If there are no offences and no ambulance required they will be returned to the Life House to 'sleep it off' in a safe environment with hourly observations. The individual will be dealt with by staff once sober and the appropriate penalty shall be given.

Police and Life House staff will work together to risk assess individuals and decide the best course of action. At a stage where there is low or no risk to an individual, they can be dealt with by the appropriate means.

Summary

In response to ASB and Street Drinking in the vicinity of Marlborough Street.

This document is the research product of data provided by the Devon and Cornwall Constabulary Performance & Analysis Department to gather evidence in support of an application for a "DPPO", a Designated Public Place Order in the vicinity of Marlborough Street and the immediate surrounding area.

To enable a Primary Tasking, and provide for daily visits to respond, disrupt and deter Street Drinking and associated Anti-Social Behavlour.

Conclusion & Inferences

The data infers there are alcohol and drink related problems recorded in the vicinity of Marlborough Street, however the data spanning 6 years records relatively few crimes annually. In addition to 12 specific street drinking incidents reported in this period, there numerous incidents of drink related ASB, where alcohol is noted as a factor.

To account for the relatively low instance street drinking offences, it is possible that officers are moving offending parties from the area without completing formal reports via the Force data systems OIS or CIS.


Data Sources, Extraction & Research Method

Data was extracted the form of Excel spreadsheets. Research Method.

- 1. Data refined and restricted to only include incidents or crimes from within the proposed DPPO geographical area as defined (As practicable).
- 2. Data refined to determine Street Drinking Offences Crimes and Incidents.
- 3. Data refined to include all alcohol related street offences and incidents.
- 4. Data tabulated and results charted.
- 5. Data analysed to conclusion.

Proposed DPPO Geographical Area

The area bounded by 2, 100m radius arcs positioned at each end of Marlborough Street and inclusive of that area included within tangential lines joining these arcs. Map 2-1 Refers.

Specifically the DPPO boundary to include Marlborough Street, Marlborough Row, Part of St Aubyn Road, Most of Granby Way, Part of Albany Street (Western end), Part of Gun Lane (western End), Morice Street, Part of Queen Street and Part of New Passage Hill.

Incidents

Incident Data Set, Summary.

The initial data set of recorded incidents numbered 21,014 incident logs between Jan 2005 and July of 2011, the first data sort pass sought to include those incidents occurring within the defined boundary area central to Marlborough Street, resulting in 4071 Logs. Further revision sorting by the removal of unrelated incidents on the categories in "Primary" and "Secondary Qualifiers" reduced the data set to 1172 logs. The final sort process identified incident logs where Alcohol was recorded as a contributing factor to the incident, and is summarised in the following table:-





Map of Crimed Offences





I write on behalf of the Friends of Devonport Park, to draw your attention to a problem that seems to be developing within the Park itself.

There has been a marked increase, of late, with Street drinkers and rough sleepers, in several areas of Devonport Park, particularly in the Memorial Garden, just inside the main park entrance. This particular area seems to be a favourite for rough sleepers, presumably because there is scope for them to conceal themselves within the heavily planted areas. During the daytime, especially mornings, they then tend to sit around on the benches drinking alcohol.

The Rose Garden/Sicilian Fountain area is also a favourite spot for drinkers. Being adjacent to the nursing home and, quite close to the children's playground, this is of some concern. On a number of occasions, police officers or PCSO's have had to move people away. Obviuosly, the current hot weather must play a part in this but, we feel that some action needs to be taken before matters get much worse.

A great deal of hard work and dedication has been put in, not least by a keen group of volunteers, to restore this "Victorian" park to such a high standard, making it an award winning and much valued green space.

The visitor numbers to Devonport Park has increased enormously since completion of the restoration but our concern is, that if this kind of behaviour continues, then there is a danger that visitors will be deterred from coming here.

I am writing in support of the application for a DPPO for the Devonport Area. Having working in the area for about a year now I can confirm that compared to other residential areas of Plymouth that PCH work in there seem to be more issues with street drinkers and on a regular basis. Until April 2013 the Devonport housing management team for PCH were located next to Granby Green and we witnessed issues with street drinkers on almost a daily basis. Mostly the individuals congregated in the block of flats and passageways where we were based and most originated from the Salvation Army Hostel. Housing staff also witnessed people drinking in or near the play area on the green.

In addition residents at Helen Fox I-louse, one of our sheltered Schemes witnessed noise nuisance on many occasions and we often find residents witness street drinkers urinating against the boiler room (Old toilets). Drug paraphernalia and drink bottles dumped in the Granby Green area (photos can be provided). Also properties have been broken into and

used by the street drinkers.

The difficulty has been that it has been going on for so long that a lot of behaviour became normalised and not reported. Many of our staff felt sympathy for the individuals we would find on a daily basis in our hallway but equally did not feel comfortable that they were there and were concerned for other residents and children who may come across individuals or groups of individuals in drink. Our Ranger team had to regularly clean up after individuals who had been drinking in our hallways and courtyards. Although the majority of tenants have left the block opposite the green, the concern remains that there are a number of individuals who use streets around Devonport for drinking. There is particular concern for vulnerable and older residents in the area and the children who live and play in the area. The behaviour that occurs in the area is very difficult to Police without such powers as in the DPPO and are concerned about the impact this has on the area and on the future developments in the area, particularly those near the green.

PCH is very supportive of this initiative for the above reasons and we have committed a sum of £500 towards the establishment of the DPPO. I hope the above illustrates why we are so

supportive of this measure.

I'm sorry, but this just isn't good enough. We have been waiting far too long for this measure and it's about time something was done.

Last night, we had a long discussion at the Devonport Neighbourhood Board about the DPPO, and it was agreed that we would continue to support it – that's support from all three ward councillors, the police, the Devonport Neighbourhood Board and local residents. I refuse for this to be ignored anymore.

Royal Assent for the new bill is yet to be scheduled, and considering the Houses rise in less than a month for Easter and May Day recesses, it's not an immediate fix. The police have said that they want the DPPO, because it gives them the power to carry out the actions which are needed in Devonport in order to rebalance and address the difficulties there. The DPPO is favoured in Devonport over the PSPO – and it's our residents who have to live with the difficulties of street drinkers, not us or licensing officers.

The money is there because Sally Hutchings got us the money. It needs to be signed off and then we can begin the consultation period (after approval from Licensing Committee), if I'm reading your email correctly? I am more than willing to play a big part in the consultation so the real views of Devonport residents are heard.

I will not accept that we are unable to do anything now because of new legislation coming through. New legislation is coming in constantly and I've never known it change the decision of anything whilst it is not law – because it isn't yet.

Is the sign off waiting on C/Supt Boulting? I want to progress with this as soon as possible. Our residents have waited long enough, and enough is enough.

Within the Devonport area, mainly Marlborough street, Marlborough Row, Granby Way and Park Avenue, we have a persistent ASB issue in relation to street drinkers. They normally start drinking on the street from 0630 in the morning leading up to the late hours in the evening. This causes residents, children, businesses and visitors cause for concern as they feel intimidated and vulnerable when having to walk past the drinkers. The reason being is that they are verbally abusive, use bad language, fights occur between them, they expose themselves whilst urinating in public, pass out on the street unconscious, theft from shops due to them not having the funds etc.

We have had a Dispersal Order in the past which has proven to work and this has ended in April 2012, following which the street drinking has increased causing an influx in calls to the 101 number. I am intending to submit a request for another Dispersal Order; however, the majority of the street drinkers live within Devonport, mainly only 5 min walk away from their premises, therefore, they cannot be dispersed out of the area where they live. Another issue being is that they are not allowed in the Salvation Army between 0900 and 1100 and if they are heavily in drink, they are turned away until they have slightly sobered up. So the issue being is where we disperse them, without then having the issue of passing the issue into the neighbouring sector.





Dear Inspector Hutchings,

I am writing to you as a Devonport ward councillor in support of the Designated Public Place Order which we so badly need in Devonport. Street drinking has been one of the biggest sources of community tension since I was elected - and long before - and I am so pleased we are, at last, at the stage where we are able to do something about it.

Street drinking not only divides the communities in the area and creates tension, but it has slowly been undoing all of the hard work put into restoring the community pride in Devonport, brought mainly by the huge regeneration we saw in the area. I believe that other approaches and attempts to deal with this issue haven't been as successful as we would have hoped, and now think it's about time a different approach was taken to tackle this issue and improve the lives of local residents who have had to live with this issue for so long.

I am looking forward to the positive outcomes that this DPPO will bring to the area, and for that reason, I fully endorse this application.
