

Following our meeting this morning where you are requesting a change of your application times and operating schedule with the addition of conditions consistent with that of the lapsed previous licence.

I therefore ask that you confirm that the details of changes below are correct

Opening times:

Sunday to Wednesday – 2300hrs to 0300hrs Thursday to Saturday – 2300hrs to 0400hrs

Conditions agreed:

- 1) The Premises Licence Holder, Designated Premises Supervisor or nominated person, shall ensure that measures shall be put in place to remove litter or waste arising from customers and to prevent such litter from accumulating in the immediate vicinity of the premises or neighbouring premises.
- 2) The Premises Licence Holder will ensure that a CCTV system is fully compliant with the guidance contained in the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) guidance document (<u>www.informationcommissioner.gov.uk</u>) regarding installation of CCTV is provided at the premises.
- 3) The CCTV system shall cover all areas of the premises to which the public have access including any outside areas.
- 4) Images shall be retained for a minimum of 31 days
- 5) The CCTV system shall be capable of downloading images to a recognizable viewable format.
- 6) At all times the premises are open for business a member of staff shall be present who is capable of operating the CCTV system and downloading images at the request of police or other authorised officer.
- 7) The CCTV system shall be capable of obtaining clear facial recognition images and a clear head and shoulders image of every person entering or leaving the premises.
- 8) The Premises Licence Holder or nominated person shall erect and maintain, in a prominent position at every exit a clear, conspicuous and legible notice requesting patrons to avoid causing noise, nuisance or disturbance to local residents.

- 9) All the rubbish produced by the premises will be stored securely in a designated area or in a bin with a tight fitting/lockable lid.
- 10) The movement of bins and rubbish outside the premises will be kept to a minimum after 2300hrs.

I object to this application on the following basis:

- Prevention of crime and disorder these premises are adjacent to residential properties and the serving of food during the proposed hours is highly likely to occur after people have been drinking alcohol and as it is very noisy now when the bars and clubs close, this is only likely to get worse. Instead of dispersing people are likely to congregate in or near the premises, leading to a risk of fights and criminal damage
- Prevention of public nuisance see above. Also there is an increased likelihood of excessive noise and litter. There is no doubt that residents will have their sleep disturbed
- Public safety see above which all constitute a risk to public safety
- Protection of children from harm children live within the residential properties. They will be subject to increased noise and lack of sleep and fear engendered by the noise of fights and rowdy behaviour

Application for a grant of a premise licence to serve hot food and drinks. The (revised) requested hours for the supply of late night refreshments are Sunday to Wednesday 23:00 to 03:00; Thursday to Saturday 23:00 to 04:00.

I would like to object to the above application and urge you to reject it. I strongly believe it will have a detrimental effect on a largely residential area.

PUBLIC NUISANCE:

Several late night bars and clubs have opened in this area recently, and the disturbance they already generate is at an unacceptable level. Allowing this outlet to serve food and drink all through the early hours will ensure it becomes a magnet for drunks. In Discovery Wharf and Century Quay (residential blocks situated only a few yards away) there would be little escape from the disturbance – late night noise is already channeled upwards from rowdy customers leaving bars and clubs nearby.

Public nuisance in this area has significantly increased. Tin Lane and Martin Lane - the narrow, cobbled streets closest to the applicant's premises - have become late-night toilets for drunken revelers, both male and female. To risk extending this kind of disturbance to 3am or 4am, when virtually everyone living in the area is asleep, is unnecessary and unwanted.

Although the revised application requests a licence for reduced hours, I believe the agreement to install and monitor CCTV footage is a clear indication of the kind of customers the applicant expects to attract.

Furthermore, CCTV at the premises will have no effect on the noise and disturbance which that custom is certain to create.

PUBLIC SAFETY / PROTECTION OF CHILDREN:

Groups of intoxicated people leaving various premises in the area often coincide, sometimes leading to shouting or scuffles. People can frequently be seen

wandering around the Barbican and Sutton Harbour with drinks in their hands - even though large parts of it are designated alcohol-free zones - later congregating around late-night food outlets.

Only rarely are police officers seen in this area (as opposed to the Barbican). I believe that to grant such a late licence will only increase this kind of anti-social behaviour, especially as late-night drinkers would leave clubs and pubs to take advantage of the extra licensing hours, if granted.

I fear there will be a dramatic increase in bottles and glasses being dropped and smashed nearby. This already happens to some extent. It puts young children walking in the area at risk of serious injury from stepping on broken glass. SUMMARY:

I am aware that conditions aimed at limiting noise, disturbance, litter and antisocial behaviour can be imposed on bars, clubs and food outlets. But if existing ones are currently subject to any such restrictions, they clearly aren't working in most cases. I believe that even the most stringent conditions will not be sufficient to limit disturbance and anti-social behaviour here.

Other areas of the city are available for those who want to buy take-away food until the early hours up to dawn.

Although I accept that a balance can be struck between safeguarding residential environments and providing certain facilities in the city, the creeping, cumulative impact of granting late-night licences in this neighbourhood — which is geographically and culturally separate from the Barbican - must surely be contrary to one of the licensing authority's stated aims: 'to secure the safety and amenity of residential communities...'
