- 4. It may also refuse to specify a designated premises supervisor and/or only allow certain requested licensable activities.



- 1. Late night refreshment will be provided by delivery service only.
- 2. The shop front will be closed and no customers are permitted on the premises after 2300hrs.
- 3. The delivery vehicle will switch off the engine and any radio whilst waiting to collect any order for delivery.
- 4. The movement of bins and rubbish outside the premises must not take place between 10pm and 7am.
- The premises licence holder will ensure that all staff on the premises after 2300hrs will conduct themselves in a manner to avoid causing a disturbance to nearby residents.

I am a tenant of Morley Court, Plymouth and live directly behind the City Grill who are applying for a late night licence. I along with my husband are very concerned about this and the possibility late night noise from customers, music and possible car engines throughout the night, we feel that having to contend with people who are on their way home from a night out screaming and shouting is bad enough and we regularly have to contend with very loud music from one of the nightclubs on Derry's Roundabout until 4am on a weekend this alone is enough in itself let alone the possibility of having people and music all through the night on our doorstep.

We are very surprised you can even consider this in a residential area where there are families living above, alongside and opposite the City Grill many who are elderly. Surely this would be construed as a form of public nuisance with constant disturbance on a daily/nightly basis. My husband and I therefore feel we had to let you know of our concerns and to confirm we most strongly object to this licence request.
