1.3 Variation application

The nature of the proposed variation is as follows;

Vary the premises licence at Annex 3 condition I (Appendix I)

To remove the requirement for a second door supervisor from 22:00hrs until closing time on Friday and Saturday evenings.

- I. Modify the conditions of the licence
- 2. Reject the whole or part of the application;

....and for this purpose the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added.

The Committee is asked to note that it may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be appropriate in order to promote the licensing objectives.

ANNEX 3 - CONDITIONS ATTACHED AFTER A HEARING BY THE LICENSING AUTHORITY

Review held on 12 September 2017

Conditions added to the Premise Licence at the hearing of 12/09/17

- I. The PLH shall provide door supervision on the following basis:
 - One door supervisor between the hours of 18:00hrs to 22:00hrs and then two door supervisors between the hours of 22.00hrs until closing time on Friday and Saturday evenings.
 - One door supervisor between the hours of 20:00hrs until closing time for the rest of the week
- 2. The PLH shall provide training on the following basis:
 - All staff to be fully trained for their job functions in the operating standards required under the Licensing Act 2003 to include dealing with disorderly behaviour and evidence training to be recorded in documentary format and must be provided to council licensing officers as soon as possible and no later than three months from now
 - Training will be repeated at least every six months thereafter and will be recorded in documentary format that will be kept at the premises and be available for inspection at the time of request by a member of any relevant authority. The records will be retained for at least 12 months.

Dear Mr Prout,

The Devon and Cornwall Police have received an application from Mr Kelland to amend the premises licence of the above premises to change the condition relating to the requirement for two doormen from 2200hrs on Friday and Saturday Nights. He wishes to reduce the number to one.

Historically these premises were of substantial concern to the police and were frequently the location of incidents of alcohol related crime and anti- social behaviour.

The premises appeared before the Plymouth City Licensing Committee on 12th September 2017 where the determination was made to attach the following conditions to the Premises Licence and are contained in Annex 3. The PLH shall provide door Supervision on the following basis.

- One door supervisor between the hours of 1800 to 2200 hours and then two door supervisors between 2200hrs and closing time on Friday and Saturday evenings
- One door supervisor between the hours of 2000hrs and closing time for the rest of the week.

The Dog and Duck by Mr Kellands own admission is s spit and sawdust establishment that caters for heavy drinking individuals, at this moment in time the police believe the management has achieved the correct balance to effectively engage with the four licensing objectives,

To change this balance by removing one door supervisor would in our opinion undermine the licensing objective of The Prevention of Crime and Disorder and inevitably lead to an increase of alcohol related violent crime and the associated Anti- Social behaviour

Under these circumstances the Devon and Cornwall Police cannot agree to this applications and will make representations to present our concerns


I write to object to the application from the Dog and Duck on Mutley Plain seeming permission to reduce its door staff.
