The meeting started at 10:30 and finished at 11:23.

1. To elect the Lord Mayor and to appoint the Lord Mayor's Chaplain for the period up to the next Annual Meeting

Council agreed that Councillor Terri Beer is elected Lord Mayor of the City for the ensuing year.

The Lord Mayor announced the appointment of Fr Robert Harris at St Mary's Church, Plympton as her Chaplain and she would arrange to transfer the Lord Mayor's chaplaincy insignia to Fr Harris.

2. To elect the Deputy Lord Mayor for the period up to the next Annual Meeting

Council agreed that Councillor Maddi Bridgeman is elected Deputy Lord Mayor of the City for the ensuing year.

3. Vote of thanks to the Retiring Lord Mayor and Deputy Lord Mayor

Council accorded to Alderman Chris Mavin the sincere thanks of the Citizens of Plymouth for the invaluable services he has rendered to the City as Lord Mayor since May 2020, and for the able manner in which he has presided over the deliberations of the Council during that period.

The Council also expresses its indebtedness to Darren Winter for his diligent and efficient discharge of the duties of Deputy Lord Mayor, and to Councillor Sue Dann as the Lady Mayoress and to Miss Helen Raynor as Deputy Lady Mayoress, who have supported them during their year in office.

Agreed that approval was given to the appointments and nominations of councillors and others as representatives on outside bodies as indicated.

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
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DECLARING INTERESTS - QUESTIONS TO ASK YOURSELF

What matters are being discussed?

Does the business relate to or is it likely to affect a disclosable pecuniary interest (DPI)? This will include the interests of a spouse or civil partner (and co-habitees):

- any employment, office, trade, profession or vocation that they carry on for profit or gain
- any sponsorship that they receive including contributions to their expenses as a councillor or the councillor's election expenses from a Trade Union
- any land licence or tenancy they have in Plymouth
- any current contracts leases or tenancies between the Council and them
- any current contracts leases or tenancies between the Council and any organisation with land in Plymouth in they are a partner, a paid Director, or have a relevant interest in its shares and securities
- any organisation which has land or a place of business in Plymouth and in which they have a relevant interest in its shares or its securities



Does the business affect the well-being or financial position of (or relate to the approval, consent, licence or permission) for:

- a member of your family or
- any person with whom you have a close association; or
- any organisation of which you are a member or are involved in its management (whether or not appointed to that body by the council). This would include membership of a secret society and other similar organisations.



Will it confer an advantage or disadvantage on your family, close associate or an organisation where you have a private interest more than it affects other people living or working in the ward?



Speak to Monitoring Officer in advance of the meeting to avoid risk of allegations of corruption or bias

C a b i n e

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Cabinet members must declare and give brief details about any conflict of interest* relating to the matter to be decided and leave the room when the matter is being considered. Cabinet members may apply to the Monitoring Officer for a dispensation in respect of any conflict of interest.

*A conflict of interest is a situation in which a councillor's responsibility to act and take decisions impartially, fairly and on merit without bias may conflict with his/her personal interest in the situation or where s/he may profit personally from the decisions that s/he is about to take.
