### 1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 On the 10<sup>th</sup> March 2020 the licensing department received an application from the Devon & Cornwall Police under Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 for the Review of the Premises Licence in respect of Bar 9 situated at First Floor, 32 Western Approach. Plymouth. PLI 1TQ.

## 1.2 Review application

Devon and Cornwall Police have applied for the review of the premises licence for the purpose of promoting the licensing objectives in relation to the Prevention of Crime and disorder, Public Nuisance and the Protection of children from harm. A Copy of this application has been served by on each of the responsible authorities and the holder of the premises licence.

A review of the licence is sought in relation to the prevention of crime and disorder, prevention of public nuisance and protection of children from harm. The grounds for the review are made based on the licensing objective and are summarised as follows:

Poor management of the premises. B) Reports of children under the influence. C) Breaches of the premises licence. D) Poor supervision and control of patrons attending the premises. E) Problems encountered to obtain CCTV footage following reports of incidents and crimes of assault, resulting in no footage supplied.

In accordance with review proceedings at 10.15hrs on 11 March 2020 a licensing officer from Plymouth City Council attended the premises and displayed the site notice at and around the vicinity of the premises.

At 10:35hrs the same day a similar notice was displayed on the public notice board at the Council House, Armada Way, Plymouth.

- 4.2 The steps are:
  - (a) to modify the conditions of the premises licence;
  - (b) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
  - (c) to remove the designated premises supervisor from the licence;
  - (d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months; or
  - (e) to revoke the licence;

and for this purpose the conditions of the premises licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added.

Where the committee takes a step in 4.2 (a) or (b), it may provide that the modification or exclusion is to have effect only for such period (not exceeding three months).

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
