4	Decision to be taken: To award a 5% uplift to Domiciliary Care, Supported Living, Residential and Nursing and Extra Care Providers for an initial period of three months to meet the additional costs of COVID-19.							
5	Reasons for decision: To meet the additional costs brought about by the COVID-19 Pandemic. These costs include additional staffing costs and increased Personal Protection Equipment use.							
6	Alternative options considered and rejected: Not to award additional funds. There are legitimate costs brought about from responding to the COVID 19 outbreak, which if not met could lead to providers encountering financial difficulties. This has the potential to impact on front line care delivery, both now and in the period of recovery from COVID 19. The government has also issued additional funding to Local Authorities to meet the costs of COVID 19 and whilst not ring-fenced, have made clear a significant proportion should be directed to Adult social Care to ensure that the provision of services for vulnerable adults is safeguarded.
