	It is recommended that the Council:-
	• Approves the Business Case for the Active Travel Fund programme (formerly known as the Emergency Active Travel Fund – Tranche 2 programme, due to a change in the title of the Fund by the Department for Transport)
	• Approves the addition of £756,200 to the capital programme funded by the Department for Transport Active Travel Fund grant.
	• Delegates the decision to allow movements across the categories within the fund to the Service Director for SP&I.

	To allow the delivery of the Active Travel Fund programme which will result in an additional £945,250 of investment in active travel in Plymouth.

	Not delivering the Active Travel Fund programme, which is substantially funded by a Department for Transport grant, is not recommended because it will prevent an additional

	£945,250 to be invested in walking and cycling in Plymouth. The Active Travel Fund programme aims to help Plymouth's walking and cycling network be more connected, direct, safe, comfortable and attractive. Its delivery, alongside complementary programmes such as the Transforming Cities Fund, will help to create an environment that is safer, and more conducive, for cycling and walking. This will allow the achievement of the short term Fund objective of replacing journeys previously made by public transport, which currently can't be accommodated due to the pandemic, as well as the long term objectives of delivering significant health, environmental and congestion benefits. The programme directly supports the Council's Climate Emergency work through encouraging
