	It is recommended that the Leader of the Council:
	Approves the Business Case
	 Allocates £1,672,900 into the Capital Programme funded by £1,597,900 from the Salix PSDS Sec31 and £75,000 from \$106 funds
	Delegates the procurement process to the Service Director for HR & OD
	Delegates the acceptance of the Salix grants to the S151 Officer
	Delegates the award of the contract to Service Director for SP&I
5	Reasons for decision: The business case covers decarbonising the heating systems at 7 PCC sites, including improving glazing, insulation and installing solar PV & Battery. The main benefit is reducing associated carbon emissions. Lowering carbon emissions will contribute to the declaration of a climate emergency, the pledge to be carbon neutral by 2030 and is part of the Corporate Carbon Reduction Plan. Nearly 3,400 tonnes of CO_2e will be reduced over the life of the measures.
	This project helps deliver JLP DEV32 – Delivering low carbon development by reducing the heating energy load and JLP DEV33 – Renewable and low carbon energy by the installation of heat pumps and solar PV.
	It also helps to deliver the promise of a "Green, sustainable city that cares about the environment" through delivering low energy heating to reduce carbon emissions and pollution.
6	Alternative options considered and rejected:
	Alternative technologies such as ground source open loop heat pumps were investigated but well-testing proved that it was not feasible for this part of the heat network, so air source heat pumps were chosen.
	Option I: Do Nothing – no capital spending or revenue pressure but PCC fails reduce its carbon emissions and loses out on government grant money (would need to be paid back).
	Option 2 : Do Minimum Option - only do buildings with energy savings (Council and Midland) but less carbon savings than the full project, challenging the net-zero by 2030 pledge, and losing out on a significant portion of grant money which would need to be topped up by PCC.
7	Financial implications: There is no additional corporate borrowing as most of the capital is grant
