	Specifically it would cause the new Boulevard Project and its public realm to be randomly parked upon prejudicing the sustainable transport measures of wide footpaths and the benefit o generous safe pedestrian movement.							
	And for Bath Lane, Bath Place West & Bath Place it will prevent vehicles otherwise parking on this very narrow street, effectively a single carriageway, causing obstruction and frustration to other modes of movement including safe pedestrian, cycle, vehicle and emergency vehicle movement.
