

Economic Update Response to committee meeting on 15 September 2021

Whether the increase in growth of part-time work had reduced the opportunities of full-time work in the city:



In Plymouth, over the period shown above (2014 to 2020), the number of full-time employees has grown by 3.96%, the number of part-time employees has grown by only 1.77%. Subsequently, the total number of employees in Plymouth has grown by 2.41%.

Based on this data, over the 7 year period, the growth in part-time employee numbers appears to have not reduced the opportunities for new full-time employment. The growth rate in full-time employees has been greater than that of part-time employees.
