5	Reasons for decision:							
	<ul> <li>There is a statutory requirement for the City Council to provide households with containers for the disposal of their waste and recycling.</li> </ul>							
	<ul> <li>Commercial Waste Services requires bins for replacements and new customers in order to grow the service and continue with the level of income generation.</li> </ul>							
	<ul> <li>The Cleansing service currently provide a number of public bins across the City which would need replacing if broken or damaged. No additional public bins are being placed within this proposal.</li> </ul>							
6	Alternative options considered and rejected:							
	Option I – Do nothing							
	This is not an option for household waste due to it being a statutory requirement. If no further bins were purchased for commercial waste customers would be lost and no additional customers and therefore revenue achieved.							
7	Financial implications and risks:							
	The total expenditure for all containers for the next three years will be £1,661,333. This will be repaid from Waste and Street Cleansing revenue budgets over the next $10$ years.
