5	Reasons for decision:							
	Mayflower Street –							
	All parking bays with electric vehicle charge points are required to be electric vehicle charging only bays. This means that the only cars that can park in these bays are electric vehicles that are charging. This solves the problem of car chargers being blocked by petrol and diesel cars. The proposal is to turn three P&D bays into two bays to accommodate a buildout for the charger and create a larger accessible bay.							
	West Hoe Road –							
	All parking bays with electric vehicle charge points are required to be electric vehicle charging only bays. This means that the only cars that can park in these bays are electric vehicles that are charging. This solves the problem of car chargers being blocked by petrol and diesel cars. There are currently five parking bays at this location. The plan is to remove one bay and create four larger bays and include a buildout where the chargers will be placed.							

6	Alternative options considered and rejected: The alternative option would be to do nothing. This option was discounted on the basis that						
	the changes are needed to ensure that EV drivers are not blocked by petrol and diesel cars when attempting to charge their cars and so that the car club vehicle always has a bay to return to.
