5	Reasons for decision:					
	Reduction of new money from Corporate for Capital Spend in 2023/24 in recognition to council wide fiscal constraint has resulted in a reduction of circa £3M to the Highways Capital Budget. To maintain maintenance to the highway and having consideration to the councils statutory commitments as outlined within the Highways Act 1980, we propose to secure the Draft allocation:

	2) Maintenance Fund					
	3) Incentive Fund					
	4) Previous draft funding allocation					
	These figures will be in addition to the already approved £2M Central Allocated Budget (Cllr).					
6	Alternative options considered and rejected:  a) Do nothing – This option is not applicable as it would conflict with statutory					

responsibilities to ensure the maintenance of highways;

b) Reduce Highway Maintenance - We have a duty of care and statutory responsibilities to maintain the Highways, funding from the Department for Transport is affected by deterioration modelling that could reduce future support from central government.
