- I. Approves the Business Case
- 2. Allocates £2,983,034 for the project into the Capital Programme funded by Youth Investment Fund grant (£1,803,034) and FM Improvement of Corporate Estate Fund (£1,180,000)
- 3. Authorises the procurement process
- 4. Authorises the Service Director for Economic Development to approve business cases and award contracts relating to this project where they would otherwise not have authority to do so.

### 5 Reasons for decision:

The proposed improvements will help transform the Tinside Lido's customer offer and experience, by investing in the repair and refurbishment of its two listed buildings:

- Underused, first floor of the main Lido building ('Building A'), to create a multi-purpose space and associated café/bar, for use by the community, particularly to enable youth progression activities.
- The single-storey building ('Building B'), located between the Lido pool and Tinside Cove (also Listed), to bring it into use as a youth outreach / watersports hub.

Together, the improvements will enable youth workers to engage with and support young people/adults to build confidence, develop skills, undertake marine-related training and learn about blue sector career opportunities in Plymouth.

PCC's match funding contribution will deliver the following essential repairs:

£150,000.00 Reception area and minimum refurbishment £320,000.00 Terrace / waterproofing Railings £60,000.00
