## Part A - Dog control at Efford and Weston Mill Cemeteries

In total 31\% of respondents visit the cemeteries regularly
69\% of respondents who visit the cemeteries regularly said dogs should be allowed on leads.
$31 \%$ of respondents who visit the cemeteries regularly said dogs should be excluded.

In total $69 \%$ of respondents do not visit the cemeteries regularly.
78\% of respondents who do not visit the cemeteries regularly said dogs should be allowed on leads.
$22 \%$ of respondents who do not visit the cemeteries regularly said dogs should be excluded.

In total 73\% of respondents own a dog.
70\% of dog owners said dogs should be allowed on leads within a marked sports pitch
$30 \%$ of dogs owners said dogs should be excluded from marked sports pitches

In total $27 \%$ of respondents do not own a dog.
14\% of non-dog owners said dogs should be allowed on leads within a marked sports pitch
86\% of non-dog owners said dogs should be excluded from marked sports pitches

In total 76\% of respondents said they walk dogs in Plymouth.
$68 \%$ of dog walkers said dogs should be allowed on leads within a marked sports pitch.
$32 \%$ of dog walkers said dogs should be excluded from marked sports pitches

In total $29 \%$ of respondents play sport on the pitches where dogs are currently required to be on a lead.
$63 \%$ of sports pitch users said dogs should be allowed on leads within a marked sports pitch.
$37 \%$ of sports pitch users said dogs should be excluded from a marked sports pitch

In total 71\% of respondents do not play sport on the pitches where dogs are currently required to be on a lead.
$51 \%$ of non-pitch users said dogs should be on a lead within a marked sports pitch.
$49 \%$ of non-pitch users said dogs should be excluded from a marked sports pitch.
