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1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 On 11th December 2023 the licensing department received an application from Jalil Ali Amin for the Grant of a Premises Licence under Section 17 Licensing Act 2003 in respect of Stoke Grill situated at 62 Devonport Road, Stoke, Plymouth. PL3 4DF

1.2 Grant application.

Takeaway food premises offering a range of Pizzas, Burgers and Kebabs.

1.3 Licensable Activities.

The following licensable activities and timings have been requested:

(i) Late Night Refreshment (Indoors)

Monday to Sunday 23:00hrs to 02:00hrs

(i) Hours Premises are Open to the Public

Monday to Sunday 16:00hrs to 02:00hrs

1.4 The applicant has submitted an Operating Schedule (Appendix A).

1.5 Premises Site Plan supplied by applicant. (Appendix B).

- the Council's own Licensing Policy with the following headed paragraphs being relevant to this application: Dispersal Policy (Page 12); Licensing Hours (Page 12), Late Night Refreshment (page 13), Location and Trading restrictions (page 17), Protecting children from harm (page 18), Public Nuisance (Page 19), Licensing conditions (page 22), Cumulative Impact Policy (page 27) the representations (including supporting information) presented by all the parties.

The Committee must take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:

1. Grant the licence as applied for subject to:
 - a. The conditions consistent with the operating schedule (modified* as considered appropriate for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives),

- b. The mandatory conditions under sections 19, 20 and 21 of the Act, and
 - c. Any other conditions considered appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives
- * modified includes altering, omitting or adding to them
2. Grant the licence as above but exclude any of the licensable activities detailed on the application from the licence
 3. Refuse to specify a designated premises supervisor
 4. Reject the application

The Committee is asked to note that it may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be appropriate in order to promote the licensing objectives.

LICENSING OBJECTIVES

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e)

The Licensee, that is the person in whose name the premises licence is issued, shall ensure that all times when the premises are for any licensable activity, there are sufficient competent staff on duty at the premises for the purpose of fulfilling the terms and conditions of the licence and for preventing crime and disorder. The Licensee shall ensure that staff will undertake training in their responsibilities. Records will be kept of training and refresher training

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Any incidents of a criminal nature that may occur on the premises will be reported to the Police.
The Licensee will install comprehensive CCTV coverage at the premises and it is operated and maintained at the premises

c) Public safety

Appropriate fire safety procedures are in place including fire extinguishers (foam, H2O and CO2), fire blanket, internally illuminated fire exit signs, numerous smoke detectors and emergency lighting (see enclosed plan for

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details of locations). All appliances are inspected annually. All emergency exits shall be kept free from obstruction at all times

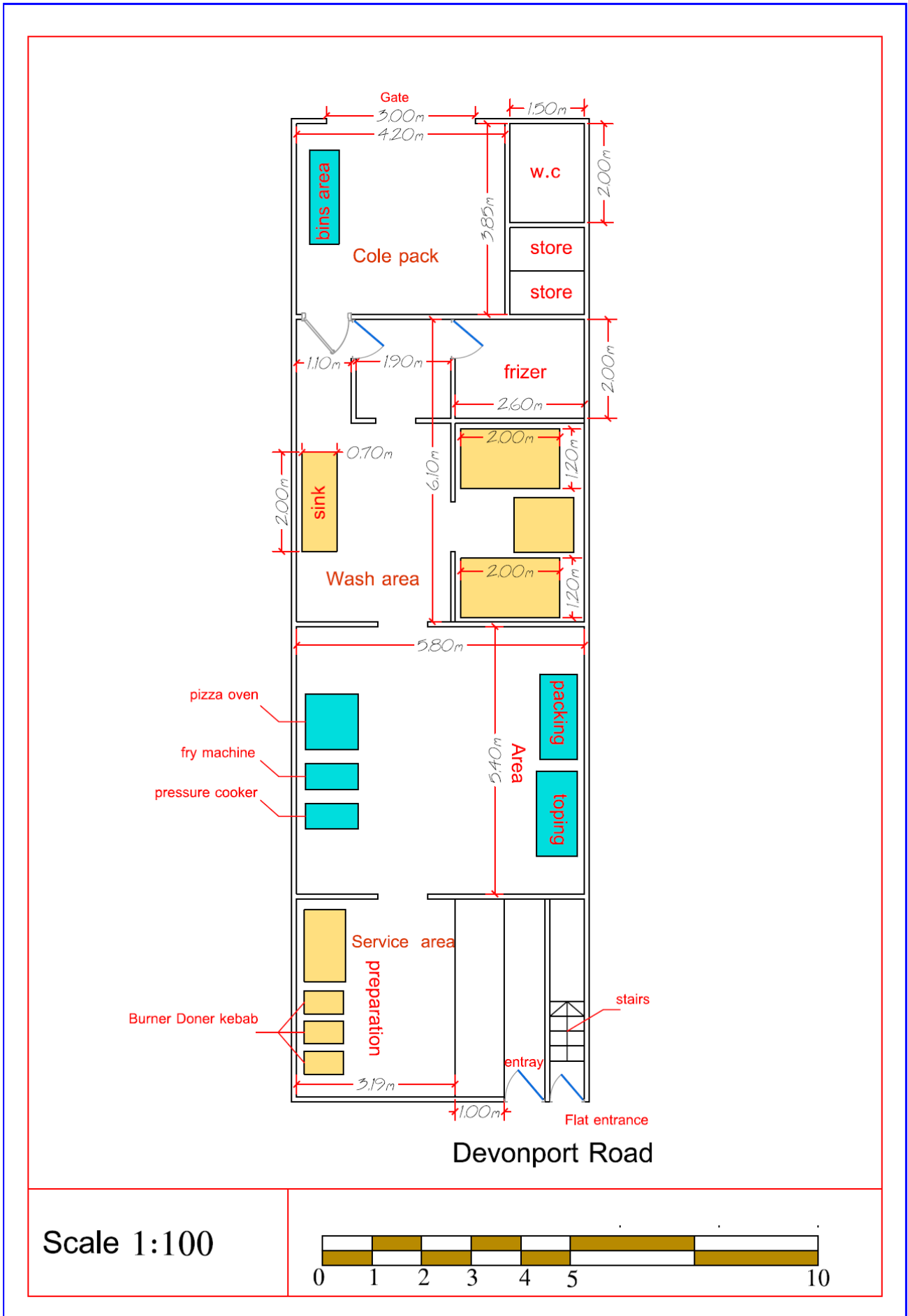
d) The prevention of public nuisance

All customers will be asked to leave quietly. Clear and legible notices will be prominently displayed to remind customers to leave quietly and have regard to our neighbours.

e) The protection of children from harm

All staff will be trained for UNDERAGE SALES PREVENTION regularly.
A register of refused sales shall be kept and maintained on the premises.

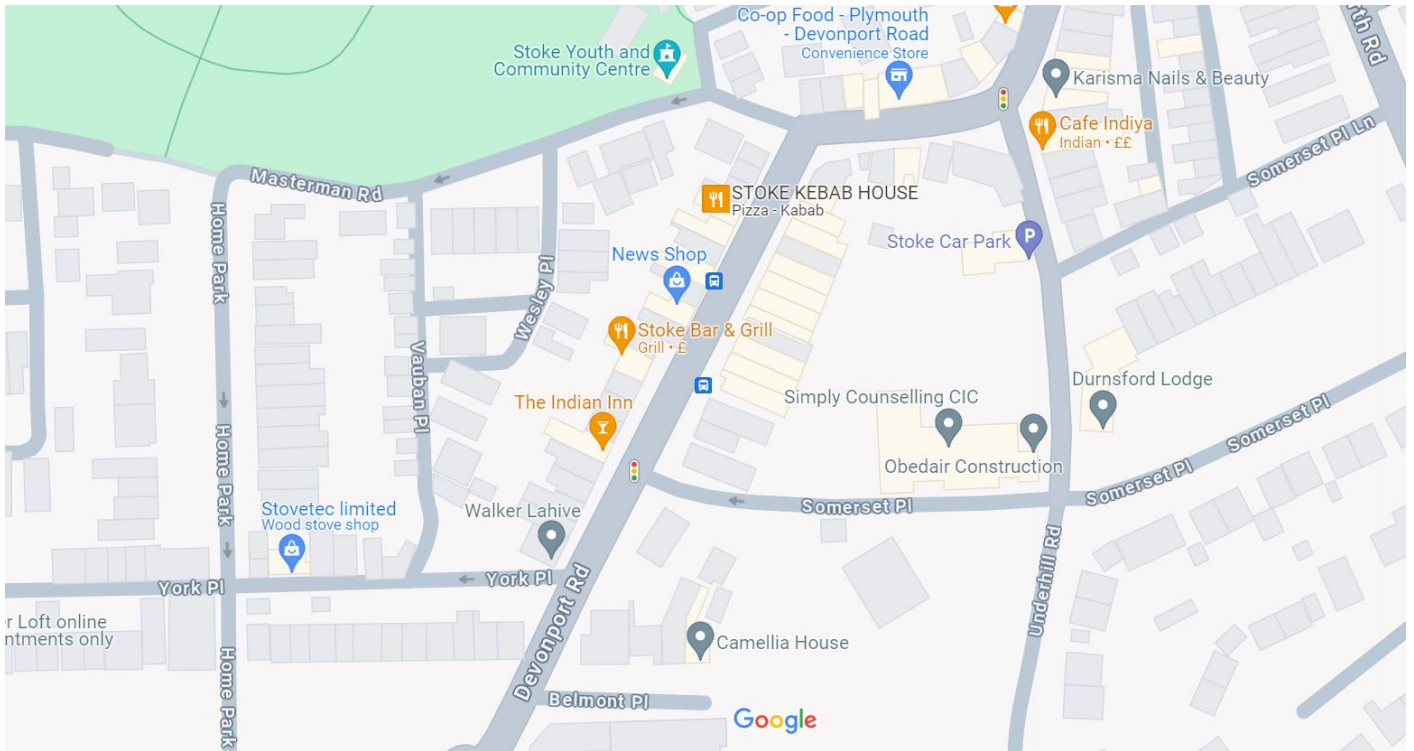

I object to this application for the following reasons.

Having placed a previous application regarding this business and its opening hours the objections raised where;

1. The noise of the drivers on their phones in the service lane to the rear
2. The filth on the streets
3. The filth in the back lane
4. The constant door slamming to the rear of the property
5. Constant coming and going without any consideration to the families trying to sleep
6. The drivers are constantly parked in the rear service lane blocking neighbour's garages – difficult enough to park in stoke village without this additional constant hassle
7. The drivers are constantly driving down the wrong way on the one-way system
8. These types of premises attract the drunks falling out of the pubs in the early hours, we as residents are greeted with the noise, vomit and worst because of their customers.
9. There has been more than one occasion where their clients have caused serious violent acts and police have been called.

All these issues are still relevant however, at the previous application the owner **promised** he would sort the problems raised.

Now it seems every week they are adding more and more lights to the premises and the light pollution is really bad – it is a major distraction to drivers and to the neighbours trying to sleep opposite.

Not one of the above issues have changed despite all the promises.

I hope you will take my concerns as seriously as you did in the previous application to extend the hrs of these premises.
