I.0 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 On the 26 November 2024, Marcus Pond gave a temporary event notice under Section 100 of the Licensing Act 2003 to the Licensing Authority. A copy of the notice was served on Devon and Cornwall Police and Environmental Health department
- 1.2 The notification is in respect of an event to take place at the Ernesettle Sports Hall, Ernesettle Lane, Plymouth, PI5 2EY. This premises is not currently authorised for any licensable activities.
- I.3 Nature of the event and Date:
 - I. 25 January 2025
 - 2. Indoor boxing event plus live music acts
 - 3. Up to 350 people
 - 4. Hours of operation 16:00hrs to 21:00hrs

The licensable activities intended within the notice are:

- I. The sale by retail of alcohol
- 2. The provision of regulated entertainment
- 1.4 Devon and Cornwall Police have given notice to the Licensing Authority that they are satisfied that allowing the premises to be used in accordance with the notice would undermine the crime prevention objective. They have also served notice on Mr Pond (APPENDIX I)
- 1.4 Any person over 18 years of age, may give a Temporary Event Notice in respect of permitted temporary activities, intended to take place other than under a licence. This may include:
 - * The sale by retail of alcohol
 - * The supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club
 - * The provision of regulated entertainment
 - * The provision of late-night refreshment
- 1.5 A temporary event notice must be given to the Licensing Authority the Police and Environmental Health department not less than 10 working days before the event takes place.
- 1.6 Only the Police and Environmental Health department are able to make objections in respect of a Temporary Event Notice on the basis of any of the four licensing objectives.

2.0 CONSIDERATIONS

- 2.1 The Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives.
- 2.2 The Committee may decide to allow licensable activities to go ahead as stated in the notice. If the notice is in connection with licensable activities at licensed premises the committee may also impose one or more of the existing conditions on the notice in so far as such conditions are not inconsistent with the event if it considers that this is appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

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- 2.3 In making its decision the Committee is also obliged to have regard to the guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Council's own Licensing Policy and the representations (including supporting information) presented by all the parties.
- 2.4 If the committee decides to impose conditions, it must give notice to the premises user which includes a statement of conditions, alternatively it can decide that the event would undermine the licensing objectives and should not take place therefore issuing a counter notice.

Good afternoon,

Please accept this as an official Representation from Devon and Cornwall Police in relation to the attached TEN under the Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety and Protection of Children from Harm, licensing objectives.

The information contained in the Temporary Event Notice is not enough to satisfy that the licensing objectives will be promoted. I have spoken with the notice giver and have requested an event management plan, for this boxing event. Without this information, I am unable to satisfy my concerns regarding possible Crime and Disorder, a risk to the public and the Protection of Children from Harm.

Should I have the information requested, and the event management plan is to standard prior to the required hearing, I may be able to withdraw my representation.
