4	Decision to be taken: To implement an Anti-Terrorism Traffic Regulation Order on The Hoe, for the safety of residents and visitors in Plymouth						
	The effect of the order shall be to allow the Police and designated partners to close off or restrict access to certain areas and roads within the ATTRO footprint when necessary, ensuring the safety and security of residents and visitors.						
5	Reasons for decision:						
	The Acting Chief Constable of Devon and Cornall Police has contacted the Chief Executive of Plymouth City Council recommending that a permanent Anti-Terrorism Traffic Regulation Order (ATTRO) is enacted by the City Council on a number of roads around Plymouth Hoe.						
	This area is used for a number of high profile events every year and a great deal of multi-agency planning goes into keeping attendees safe, particularly from the threat of terrorism						
	An ATTRO will provide for the deployment of hostile vehicle mitigation assets and for road closures without notice although this would only be in situations where the Police advise of an immediate threat with most events subject to a public engagement process similar to that currently being used.						
6	Alternative options considered and rejected: No other options are being considered, this is for the safety of the public.						
7	Financial implications and risks: The Traffic Regulation Order and associated works are being funded by the Parking Team, under code 0382-5517.
