Purpose of Report

In January 2025, City Council agreed the Motion on Notice: <u>Strengthening Measures to Combat Youth Vaping</u>. The MoN included a request that the 'existing Health and Wellbeing Board's position statement on vaping be reviewed to account for the changing use by children'.

This report provides a review of the existing position on vaping. It includes consideration the latest evidence on uptake of vaping by children and young people, an overview of the broad range of responses by the Children and Young People system in Plymouth, and a summary of the recent changes in law.

Recommendations and Reasons

That the health and wellbeing board:

- 1. Re-affirm their support for the Vaping Position Statement 2019 (as amended in September 2023), and confirm that in remains fit for purpose to date;
- 2. Notes that "this is a dynamic situation, and we will continue to review and respond to new evidence as it emerges" (Vaping Position Statement 2023);
- 3. Notes and commends work building a city-wide approach to vaping as presented to the Health and Wellbeing Board in July 2024 and work subsequently undertaken under the Schools Place Based Improvement Plan;
- 4. Acknowledges the requests of the Motion on Notice heard at Full Council in January 2025 as actioned.

Alternative options considered and rejected

Not review the existing Vaping Position Statement: Rejected as City Council agreed a Motion on Notice in January 2025 requesting this review be undertaken. The lack of an agreed position to inform citywide efforts to reduce the prevalence of smoking would result in a piecemeal approach and the continued confusion in the minds of the public between the risks and benefits associated with vaping.
