Between 29 May 2025 and 04 August 2025, the Council undertook the "Big Community Consultation" on its proposals for local government reorganisation, with additional engagement events and meetings held with local businesses, public sector partners, and communities in both the proposed extension area and Plymouth extending through to 08 October 2025. This engagement was designed to meet the four Gunning Principles and respond to government requirements, particularly concerning community engagement and stakeholder support. The Council adopted a multi-channel strategy to reach a wide and diverse audience across all affected areas, including a dedicated project website, tailored surveys, facilitated conversation events, stakeholder briefings, and a targeted media campaign. The engagement was structured to allow meaningful input before the final business case is submitted to Government, taking place at a formative stage whilst the proposal was still being developed. Clear and accessible information was provided throughout, residents and stakeholders had adequate time to respond, and feedback was conscientiously considered and has directly informed the development of the final proposal. This comprehensive approach reflects our commitment to moving progressively from informing and consulting towards collaborating and empowering, building community confidence and capacity along the way.

Insurance Contracts Commencement of Procurement Process

Issue Details Issue History

Insurance contracts are due for renewal from 01 April 2026. The timetable for consideration of options and completion of the renewal exercise means that evaluation will not take place until January-February 2026 and if a full tender exercise is undertaken the contract award needs to be made by early March 2026. This will not leave sufficient time for a report to be prepared in time for any financial implications on the insurance budget to be assessed for inclusion in the 2026/27 budget.

It is therefore proposed that the Leader of the Council authorises the procurement process and delegates authority to the Service Director for Finance to award the contract, where they would not already have the authority to do so, to ensure the provision of insurance will take effect from 01 April 2026.

It is proposed that the contracts be for five years to ensure continuity throughout the LGR process, with the approximate value in the region of £8,500,000.
