Overview and Scrutiny Commission - 2 July 2009

- The work programme request in respect of a review of Plymouth Skateboarding Byelaw was approved, to be added to the work programme of the Growth & Prosperity OSP
- The work programme request in respect of a Task and Finish Group review of the Waste Collection Policy and Arrangements was referred to the Customers and Communities OSP, as it now fell within their terms of reference.
- In respect of Sustainable OSP minute 6.1 (1), the O&S Commission identified the Customers &

Communities OSP as responsible for the anti social behaviour issue.

- Sustainable OSP minute 6.1, the O&S Commission confirmed that operational housing services
 would be the responsibility of the Customers & Communities OSP and strategic housing would be
 the responsibility of the Growth & Prosperity OSP.
- Regarding Sustainable OSP minute 6.1, the Growth & Prosperity OSP was identified as the
 appropriate Panel for considering strategic future waste disposal arrangements and the Customers
 & Communities OSP identified as the appropriate panel to consider the day to day running of the
 service.

Comments by Members included the suggestion that the City Development Company, in particular clarity about the outcomes of the CDC and what steps had been taken to ensure that appropriate support arrangements were in place, should be included in the work programme of the new Growth and Prosperity OSP.
