The budget is held within the Housing Revenue Account and will be used to meet the needs of council tenants with respect to minor environmental, safety and security enhancements but could be used towards more capital schemes if desired. Such schemes would remain on the capital programme with a corresponding revenue contribution to capital outlay made from the revenue allocation to offset the costs.

#### INTRODUCTION

The Capital Environmental Budget was set up in September 2000 following a request for resources to be made available from within the Housing Capital Programme. This would enable capital environmental works to be undertaken on council estates and was funded from the capital major repairs allowance. This changed by delegated decision in the year 2004/2005 to being funded directly from the Housing Revenue Account which gave the budget greater scope of works of a minor or revenue nature, which in turn, would broaden the scope for security, safety and environmental improvements for tenants.

#### **Current Financial Year 2009 – 2010**

For the current financial year 2009 – 2010 the budget allocation was maintained at the previous level of £220,000 and was divided per capita property between the remaining housing stock. This equated to a sum of approximately £14.64, which again, was multiplied by the number of properties within each Area Committee's remit.

The Budshead, Southway and Honicknowle Area has a total of 4,919 properties, which at an allocation of £14.64 per property gives a budget of £72,014.

Ward budgets are Budshead £21,901, Southway £18,212 and Honicknowle £31,901.

#### **SPECIAL BUDGET PROVISION FOR 2009-10**

Members will no doubt be aware that the Housing Services are to be transferred from Plymouth City Council to a new association who will take on the ownership and management of the Councils' 15,000+ properties. This is intended to take effect from mid October this year. Therefore the actual budget available for spend will be restricted to half of the annual budget (ie: for the six months April through to October), hence for the Budshead, Southway and Honicknowle Area Committee, members will have a budget of £36,007 to commit.

This is split per Ward as follows: Budshead £10,951, Southway £9,106 and Honicknowle £15,950.

It is important that this sum is committed prior to the Housing Services anticipated transfer date of Monday the 19<sup>th</sup> October 2009. Following the actual date this programme and budget will cease to exist.

## **Remaining Budgets for 2009**

Budshead members have £7,879 to commit

Southway members have £1,678 to commit

Honicknowle members have committed their budget.

Members are requested to advise the author of this report of any agreed proposals as a matter of urgency as this budget will cease from the date of transfer of the Housing Service to Plymouth Community Homes.

The new association is due to take ownership from the 19<sup>th</sup> October 2009.

#### **Community Projects Post Transfer**

Once transfer has taken place there will no longer be a member led housing budget for approving community projects. No further reports will be submitted to the Area Committee.

There will be a new fund called The Money Tree Fund which will be available to tenants, tenants' groups and officers for such projects to be considered.

It is anticipated that any suggestions for improvement to the communal areas of the housing stock or land/facilities (parks, paths, green areas, parking bays etc) will be the subject of a formal proposal (following local consultation and costing) to a third party panel of tenants and officers for discussion and approval. Members will not be part of this panel.

If Ward members have suggestions for community projects they would need to contact and discuss these with the relevant residents' groups or local housing office.

Finally, any remaining uncommitted proposals will be identified and considered under the initial round of approvals of the new budget.

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
