

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH
BYELAWS FOR GOOD RULE AND GOVERNMENT

Byelaws made under Section 235 of the Local Government Act 1972 by the Council of the City of Plymouth for the good rule and government of the City of Plymouth and for the prevention and suppression of nuisances, and under Section 164 of the Public Health Act 1875 and Sections 82 and 83 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act 1907.

EXTENT

1. These byelaws apply to the specified parts of Plymouth designated in the Schedule to the byelaws and hereinafter referred to as the "designated areas".

SKATEBOARDING

2. No person shall in any of the designated areas skate, slide or ride on rollers, skateboards, wheels, mechanical contrivances or other equipment in such a manner as to cause danger or nuisance or give reasonable grounds for annoyance to other persons lawfully using any of the designated areas.

PENALTY

3. Any person offending against byelaw 2 shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 2 on the standard scale.

REVOCATION

4. The byelaws relating to skateboarding which were made by the Council of the City of Plymouth on the 7th March 1995 and were confirmed by the Secretary of State for the Home Department on 12th July 1995 and consented to by the Secretary of State for Transport on 20th July 1995 are hereby revoked.

SCHEDULE

The "designated areas" referred to in byelaw 2 and delineated by black hatching on the plans attached to these byelaws are as follows:-

AREAS REFERRED TO ON PLAN 1

1. Pedestrianised areas between:

- (i) Royal Parade and Princess Street
- (ii) Princess Street and Notte Street.
2. Armada Way.
3. Land outside of the Combined Courts, those parts of Armada Way and Princess Street adjoining the Courts and land adjoining the Guildhall.
4. Hoe Park.
5. Hoe Promenade.
6. The Hoe (and land adjacent thereto).
7. Land and foreshore, including jetties, ramps and steps, situated between Hoe Road and the sea.
8. Those parts of Princess Street, Notte Street, Citadel Road and Hoe Road which link the above areas.

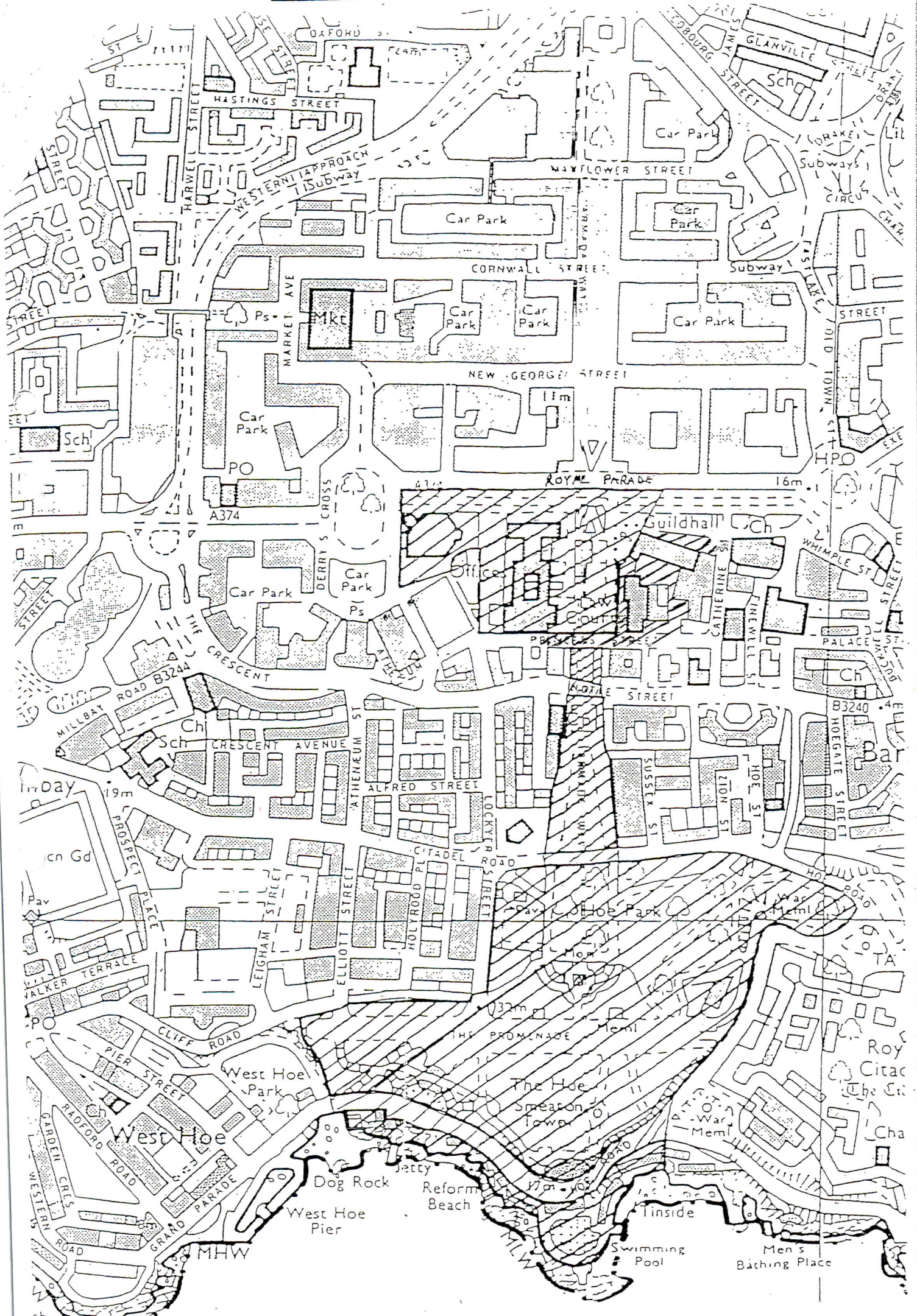
AREAS REFERRED TO ON PLAN 2

10. Pedestrianised areas situate at the Broadway, Plymstock, Plymouth.

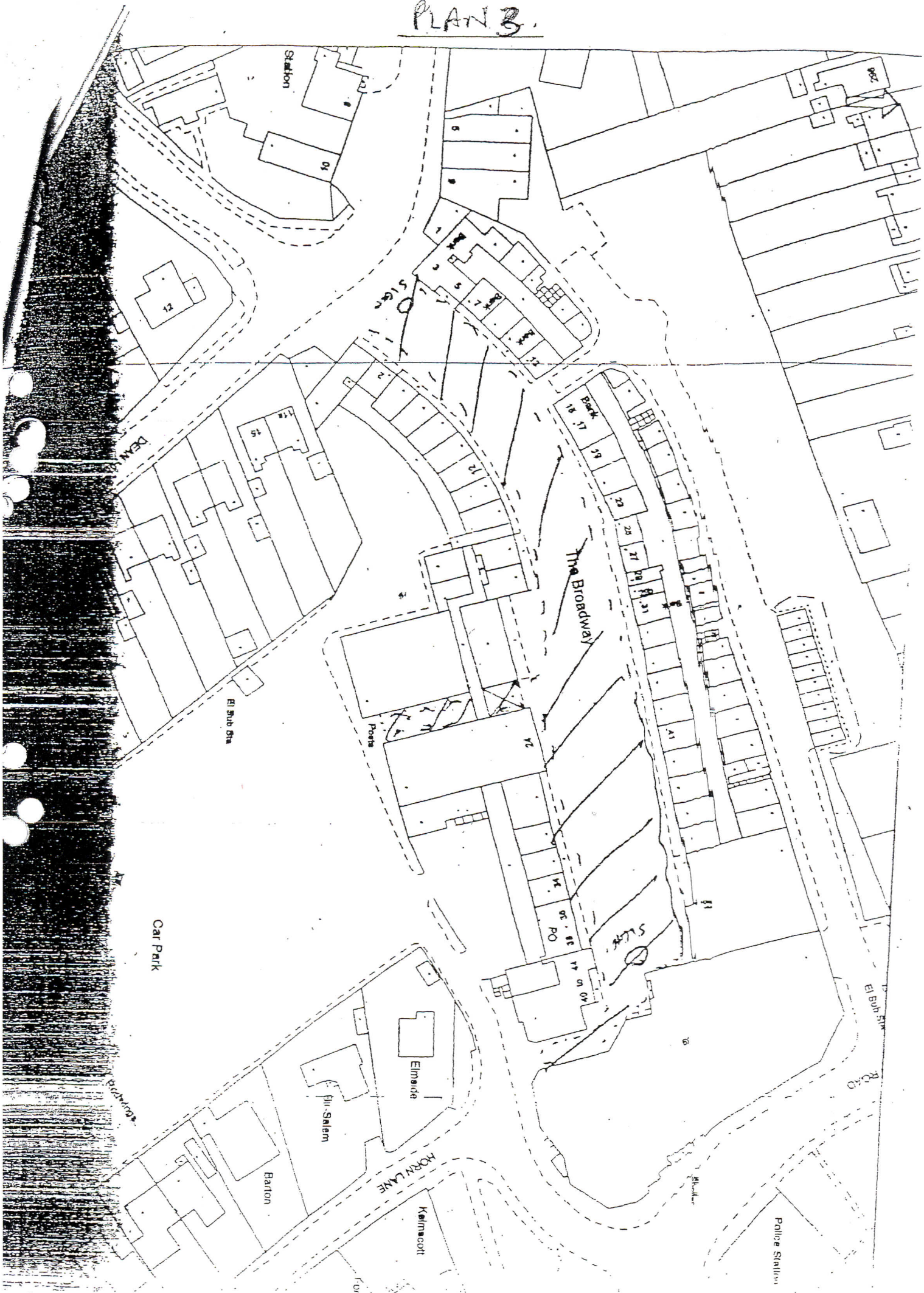
PLAN I
