- 1. Modify the conditions of the licence
- 2. Reject the whole or part of the application; and for this purpose the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added.

The Committee is asked to note that it may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be necessary in order to promote the licensing objectives.

Public Nuisance

 A winding down period shall be established at least 30 minutes before closing time to create a mood change.

(To have a calming effect on the patrons prior to leaving to reasonably control the quiet manner in which patrons leave the vicinity. Typically, music will be turned down and lights may be turned up.)

In the absence of the DPS you shall have a nominated deputy in place who
understands the restrictions of the premises licence. A nominated deputy will
be empowered to address any problems identified by a representative of a
Responsible Authority.

(The nominated person shall have ultimate control of music/ sources of noise and should have an understanding of their responsibility to reasonably uphold the requirements of the four licensing objectives.)

Public Safety

 Door staff who are suitable trained shall be provided on the premises during busy periods to reduce the potential for overcrowding.

(Door staff should be registered with the Security Industry Authority. Door staff will also be able to ensure that doors remain closed during regulated entertainment in order to further promote the licensing objective to prevent a public nuisance.)
