3.	Local Area Agreement Q2 report  LAA Q2 update The Local Area Agreement report for quarter 2 was presented by Jeremy Walding (JW) Public Health Business Manager NHS Plymouth. He raised a number of points stating that the report was now an exceptional report highlighting the areas for concern only, in relation to the stretch targets set for 2007/10 and the LAA targets for 2008/11. The areas of concern that were raised for the stretch targets included the following:  Teenage pregnancy The latest data (2008 quarter 2) reports that our rolling average conception rate is 43.7, our lowest for 4 years. Compared to last year (53.5) this is a reduction of 9.8 which equates to 20 conceptions. This is the 4th consecutive quarter drop, whilst the actual numbers are very low, we are reporting a reducing trend although still not sufficient to meet the end of year target		
	Obesity amongst children The performance in the obesity rate for children is also not on track, although a plan of action for the immediate future has been drawn up with a request for a dedicated obesity coordinator for the operational delivery of the plan. Po'S reported that he was now in a position to recruit to a post which would lead on this LAA target area.  Healthy schools There has been a noticeable increase in performance in the Q2 period from 82% to 88%. This still falls short of the target of 97% but highlights improvements that are being in made in the last quarter.	Po'S	

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	Alcohol misuse There is no available data for Q2, however we are confident that there are now additional young adults in structured treatment with other providers and this will be hopefully be verified in the future when we receive actual figures from the National Treatment Agency.		
	Smoking Performance data for Q2 will not be available until 10th Dec 09. Although this is not performing as expected there has been a significant increase in referrals in this area and also the Smoking Cessation service can confirm that every pregnant women who smokes is now offered smoking cessation		
	Unscheduled bed days This target is still off track. However there is a possibility of a misinterpretation in the reporting of bed days has occurred which is currently being investigated. This may lead to a reduction in the reported figures.		
	Direct payments This target has come off track slightly, mainly caused by quarterly variations. There is however confidence that the target will achieve by year end.

	CD introduced the NHS Plymouth Strategic Framework document, final draft. This document sets out the strategic priority intentions of NHS Plymouth and has been strongly influenced by both the city health strategy; Healthy Plymouth and the Joint Strategic Needs Assessment.
