

# Service Delivery: Plymouth NHS Stop Smoking Service

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Presented to	The Health Scrutiny panel
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#### **Background:**

Plymouth NHS Stop Smoking Service directly contributes to the Plymouth PCT corporate vision: 'Healthy people leading healthy lives in healthy communities' & directly to the priorities of reducing health inequalities and preventing ill health. Smoking is the primary cause of health inequalities in Plymouth.

These priority outcomes are reflected in the PCTs WCC outcomes, VS targets, LAA targets & SHA ambitions. Our priority is improving the quality and efficiency of smoking cessation services across Plymouth and reducing the number of people who smoke tobacco. This is a strategic objective to reduce health inequalities in Plymouth and is driven by the NHS Operating framework, PSA targets, SHA ambitions, LAA targets, vital signs, national indicator set, DH & NICE guidance. Our challenge is to provide a comprehensive smoking cessation service and reduce smoking prevalence in Plymouth, in particular the deprived areas of the city.

This is a large scale programme and involves multiple work streams currently including:

- Partnership work with the Tobacco Control lead in the LA shaping IDeA funded projects
- Facilitating Plymouth Smoke Free Alliance
- Developing patient pathways such as elective surgery
- Implementation of a voucher scheme for NRT
- Increasing provision for Nurse Prescribing within the service
- Varenicline equal first line in the PAJF
- Service evaluation and needs assessments including PPI projects
- Introducing data capture systems and policy
- Reviewing current data quality and analysis
- Continual development, implementation and review of comms strategy

- Improved media relations and PR
- Developing a service website
- Quality assessment of services in primary care
- Development of training provision
- Introduction of a Pharmacy LES
- Review of service protocol and patient pathways
- · Provision of 'out of hours' services
- Developing services and access to deprived areas of Plymouth
- Introducing a centralised 'One stop shop' based in the city centre
- Securing long-term accommodation in secondary care setting



In the context of National Guidance (NICE, DH etc) the service is performing well and meets most of the recommendations and requirements. NICE suggest that an NHS Stop Smoking Service should aim to see at least 5% of quit attempts. Plymouth sees in excess of 10%. NICE suggest a guit rate of 35%. Plymouth historically has seen guit rates of 50%.
