1.0 BACKGROUND

- 1.1 On the 15th January 2010 Mr Tom Macpherson gave 3 Temporary Event Notices under Section 100 of the Licensing Act 2003 to the Licensing Authority. Copies of these notices were served on the Devon and Cornwall Police at Charles Cross Police Station.
- 1.2 These notifications are in respect of three events taking place at the Wee Clipper, 29 Southside Street, Plymouth.
- 1.3 Nature of the event:
 - 1. Friday 29th January 2010 to Monday 1st February 2010 (96 hours). Live music event.
 - 2. Friday 5th February 2010 to Monday 8th February 2010 (96 hours). Live music event.
 - 3. Friday 12th February 2010 to Monday 15th February 2010 (96 hours). Live music event.

The licensable activities intended within the notice are:

The provision of regulated entertainment.

The sale by retail of alcohol.

- 1.4 Devon and Cornwall Police have registered their objection to the above applications under the crime prevention licensing objective. They have also served notice on Mr Tom Macpherson (APPENDIX 1)
- 1.5 Any person over 18 years of age may give a Temporary Event Notice in respect of permitted temporary activities, intended to take place other than under a licence. This may include:
 - * The sale by retail of alcohol
 - * The supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club to, or to the order of, a member of the club
 - * The provision of regulated entertainment
 - * The provision of late night refreshment
- 1.6 A Temporary Event Notice must be given to the Licensing Authority and the Police not less than 10 working days before the event takes place.
- 1.7 Only the Police are able to make objections in respect of a Temporary Event Notice and then <u>only</u> on the grounds; *that to allow the event to take place would undermine the crime prevention objective*

2.0 CONSIDERATIONS

- 2.1 The Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to promoting the crime prevention objective.
- 2.2 In making its decision the Committee is also obliged to have regard to the guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Council's own Licensing Policy and the representations (including supporting information) presented by all the parties.
- 2.3 The Committee would need to consider whether it is necessary for the promotion of the crime prevention objective to give a 'counter notice' in respect of the Temporary Event Notice given by Mr Tom Macpherson.
