Public Nuisance

 Percussion instruments shall not be used at the premises as part of any live regulated entertainment set.
 (To reduce noise and bass intrusion from music on neighbouring residential

properties)

 Access and egress of patrons via the door opening onto Frederick St East (accessed from the corridor by the toilets) shall not be permitted, except in the event of an emergency. (To reduce noise breakout)

Public Safety

 A suitable air management system must be present and maintained on the premises in order to control the indoor temperatures during regulated entertainment: when doors and windows must remain closed. (Regard must be had for the soundproofing of the proposed works as set out in Estimation Ref: SWV 460 as provided by SWV Solutions to prevent noise breakout in line with the Licensing Objective for the prevention of a public nuisance. Any such air management system should be installed by no later than 31st March 2010)

<u>Licensing Act 2003</u> <u>Supporting Information for Committee Hearing following the Environmental</u> Regulation Service Representation

Premise Name: Duchy of Cornwall

This department has made representation based on the following information.

The close proximity of the premises to residential properties on Anstis Street and Frederick Street East in particular gives this Authority cause for concern in respect of the potential for noise disturbance on local residential dwellings.

Noise breakout from the premises (as previously has been witnessed) has contributed towards sound reverberation in the Streets outside the premises, causing distinct noise vibration and echo which have enabled the sound to travel further. The ability to reasonably control indoor temperatures would negate the need to keep windows and doors open, and would therefore help reduce the negative effects of the music noise in the community.

Complaints concerning noise disturbance and public safety issues have been raised by residents in the vicinity. Officers from this Authority have witnessed noise emanating from the premises that have been in breach of current licence conditions on several occasions. The proposals put forward have been designed to reduce the potential negative impact of noise activity on the community, and will work in conjunction with the current licence conditions. This should provide the Designated Premises Supervisor with a more ridged framework within which to operate.

This Environmental Health Department has been working with the business to reduce the previously identified noise disturbance issues. A noise limiter has been installed and levels are currently in the process of being set.

Dear Sir or Madam

Re: Application for Entertainment Licence. Duchy of Cornwall 14 Anstis Street Stonehouse Plymouth.

I am writing to you as the representative of the Frederick Street Residents. We wish to raise our objections to the granting of this licence. We feel that by granting this licence the quality of our lives would be severely affected. We already suffer the consequences of the patrons actions. Which usually involves loud and abusive language, fighting and scuffles outside the pub and general Anti-Social behaviour associated with the consumption of alcohol. With extended opening hours we feel that this problem will be exacerbated and we feel that many sleepless nights will follow for the residents. We also feel that this noise and disturbance will not end at the times stated with people not dispersing from the vicinity. A large number of the residents are elderly and have no wish to suffer this disturbance in an otherwise quiet street. The Licencees of these premises tend to leave the empty aluminum beer barrels outside of the pub. We have experienced the noise created by patrons rolling these barrels around in moments of high spirits. We are afraid that it is only a matter of time before one is thrown and significant damage will be caused. We believe that leaving these items outside of the premises, highlights the irresponsibility of the managers and staff. This also represents an obstacle on the pavement for the elderly residents to negotiate.

These are the grounds on which we serve notice to Plymouth City Council. Namely that our quality of life will be undermined. That our properties could suffer damage and that we would have to contend with Anti- Social behaviour on many nights of the week.

I have also enclosed a petition from the people who also object to the proposed granting of this licence.
