#### **Public Nuisance**

1. Where regulated entertainment is held inside the premises, doors and windows will be kept shut at all times.

(To prevent the escape of noise late at night that may negatively impinge on a local residents use and enjoyment of their premises, this condition does not restrict the reasonable access and egress of patrons)

Live and Recorded music outdoors will only be permitted when a function has been pre-booked and a substantial meal is provided as part of that function.

(The provision of entertainment outdoors should only be permitted as part of a prebooked function with a sit down meal from the main menu or with a buffet. Regulated entertainment outdoors is not permitted unless food is provided)

3. All regulated entertainment will last no more than three hours duration, inclusive of any breaks.

(To reduce the length and duration of noise activities to reduce the potential for Public Nuisance)

4. No more than 12 performances of regulated entertainment outdoors shall be permitted in any calendar month.

(To reduce the potential for public nuisance)

- A member of staff will be nominated to deal with noise complaints, and will respond to local residents concerns if issues are raised, as well as any reasonable request made by an Officer of a Responsible Authority.
- Music noise should not be excessive/unreasonable at any time, responsible member of staff should take action to control music noise if found to be excessive/unreasonable.

- 7. A senior member of staff (manager) will assess the impact of any noisy activities on neighbouring residential premises at the start of the activity/entertainment and periodically throughout the activity/entertainment. (To ensure that noise levels are reasonable and that they are not increased. This member of staff should have ultimate control over the level of noise generated by the entertainment)
- 8. A diary of entertainment will be maintained at the premises and will be made available for inspection at the request of any representative of a Responsible Authority. Details of entertainment events must be documented within this diary and should include: Name, date and times of pre-booked performance, if any complaints have been received, if any action was taken to control music noise, and the time at which regulated entertainment ceased. (This will form part of you management controls in order to ensure and prove that music events do not exceed your permitted maximum number of events as determined by your licence conditions)

This application requests regulated entertainment be permitted outdoors, as such the noise from music will not be reasonably controlled within the structure of the premises which will allow noise to escape from the venue.

We the undersigned wish to submit our objections to the licence application given above. The application as presented in the window of the restaurant to extend opening hours is as follows:

Mon – Sat till 02:00am and Sunday 11:30pm inside Mon – Thu till midnight, Fri – Sat till 01:00am, Sun to 11:00pm OUTDOORS in the "beer garden"

Furthermore on checking the details of the application with your department we find that the restaurant has failed to advertise the full details i.e. they have not included the fact they wish to have live music/recorded music both inside and OUTDOORS of the premises as follows:

#### **Live Music**

Mon – Thu till 11:00pm hours indoors and OUTDOORS Fri – Sat till 01:00am indoors and midnight OUTDOORS Sun – till 11:00pm hours indoors and OUTDOORS

#### **Recorded Music**

Mon – Thu till 01:00 hours indoors and midnight OUTDOORS
Fri – Sat till 02:00 indoors and 01:00 OUTDOORS
Sun – till 23:00 hours indoors and OUTDOORS

To put our objections in context it should be noted that the premises concerned back onto the residential area of St Johns Street and that the "beer garden" shares a wall with the garden of no 2 St Johns Street and the joint access lane between St Johns Street and Alma Street.

As you can imagine in a residential area we have both adults and children who need to get to sleep at a reasonable hour not just during the week but at weekends also, to enable them to go to work and school. We would also expect to be able to have our windows open during the summer months and be able to listen to our own TV's / music without interference from events held in the "beer garden". There have been occasions when this has not been possible with the current arrangements of temporary licences for their occasional events and would only become worse should the licence be extended.

To date we have been understanding when occasional events have been held, there have been a number of disco's and live band's OUTDOORS in the beer garden past midnight and singing and shouting of drinkers in the beer garden up until closing time. As they do not have a license for music OUTDOORS they rely on temporary licences for the events, and have a regular events list for the coming months.

Residents objection to licence application dated 14 June 2010 by Heaven, PL4 UNG

We believe this request to extend opening hours with the corresponding request for a music licence OUTDOORS in a residential area would adversely affect a number of elements relating to your Licensing objectives, and therefore do not believe that an extension of their licence that also includes music outside of the premises until 11:00/midnight/01:00am in a residential area is viable.

We understand that in addition to the Noise Act 1996 noise nuisance is also incorporated into the Environmental protection act 1990, and is aimed at preventing the quality of our environment being reduced through excessive noise which could come from loud music, anti-social behaviour from nearby businesses, where the noise is loud and intrusive, whether persistent or intermittent, and which affects the quality and comfort of your life. Going on past events in the "beer garden" we can categorically say that the noise from the bands/disco's is loud and intrusive, affects our comfort and quality of life not least with having to have our windows closed during the summer evenings.

In conclusion we would hope you look favourably on our objections, whilst we do not wish to stand in the way of business success we would not wish it to come at the expense of local residents quality of life.
