Report

- 1. Mr. Jacob Lee Journeaux is a licensed Hackney Carriage driver, having been first granted a Hackney Carriage driver's licence by this Council on the 19 August 2011. His current licence is due to expire on 18 August 2013.
- 2. On the 4 August 2012, during an enforcement patrol, the vehicle driven by Mr Journeaux was found to be un-roadworthy.
- 3. The details of the inspection are as follows,

The rear passenger side tyre was found to be worn to below the legal limit of 1.6mm. A photo of the tyre is reproduced at the end of this report as Appendix A.

The vehicle licence was immediately suspended, the wheel was changed on the roadside and the suspension was lifted after the wheel change. A copy of the suspension notice is reproduced as Appendix B

4. Members are made aware that vehicles driven by Mr Journeaux have been inspected by licensing officers on other occasions.

On 11 May 2012, on a Joint Enforcement operation with Devon and Cornwall Police, the vehicle driven by Mr Journeaux, V363ECD, licence number 842, was found to have both front tyres worn to below the legal limit, and a rear passenger side tyre was recorded as having 1.7mm of tread. The vehicle was immediately suspended, and a Fixed Penalty Notice was issued to Mr Journeaux by Police Officer 5883. The suspension notice was lifted the following day after the vehicle was presented in a satisfactory condition.

On 3 February 2012, the vehicle driven by Mr Journeaux, W979ULX, licence number 777, was found to have the passenger side rear tyre worn to below the legal limit. The vehicle was immediately suspended. The suspension notice was lifted the same day after the vehicle was presented in a satisfactory condition.

Copies of these notices are reproduced as Appendix C and D

The vehicles driven by Mr Journeaux are hired by him from two different proprietors. Both proprietors have previously been seen by Officers and they are satisfied that the proprietors have procedures in place to deal with these matters, when advised and required to do so. Members are made aware that, as the driver of this vehicle, Mr Journeaux is responsible for its road worthiness.

5. Members are made aware that Mr. Journeaux has also been issued with two warning notices for Bye-Law contraventions.

On 11 November 2011 he was issued a written warning for failing to wear a drivers' badge when plying for hire.

On 2 March 2012 on a Joint Agency Operation with Devon and Cornwall Police, he was issued a written warning for Failing to Proceed, as he was plying for hire while not on a Hackney Carriage stand.

Copies of these notices are reproduced as Appendix E and F

6. Members are made aware that all these incidents occurred during his probationary year as a Hackney Carriage driver.

- 7. Members are asked to consider whether Mr Journeaux is a "fit and proper" person and whether any action should be taken against his Hackney Carriage driver's licence in light of the lack of maintenance of the vehicles that he drives and lack of consideration for the rules pertaining to Hackney Carriages and drivers.
- 8. The actions open to Members are those contained in Section 19(1) (b) of the Plymouth City Council Act 1975 which empowers the Council to suspend, revoke or refuse to renew the licence of a driver of a Hackney Carriage or Private Hire vehicle for any other reasonable cause.
- 9. In reaching their decision, Members must have regard to the Council's Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Licensing Policy. The relevant parts of the Council's policy are detailed below:

General Policy

The Council's Hackney Carriage and Private Hire licensing policy states that the Council will carry out its Hackney Carriage and Private Hire licensing function with a view to promoting stated objectives. Members must therefore ensure that they consider those objectives when forming a decision.

The Licensing objectives are as follows:

- 1. Safety and health of drivers and the public e.g.
 - Consideration of history of convictions and cautions
 - Driver training, qualification and performance
 - Health and Fitness to fulfil the role
 - Crime prevention measures
- 2. Vehicle safety, comfort and access
- 3. To prevent crime and disorder and to protect consumers e.g.
 - Commitment to work with the police and licensing authorities
- 4. To encourage environmental sustainability

Chapter 2. – Conditions of Licence

Paragraph 12.3 states that when considering whether someone is "fit and proper" the authority will consider amongst other things

- Relevant skills
- Knowledge
- Experience
- Qualifications
- Criminal record (as to relevance of offences)
- Previous history as a licence holder

Paragraph 18.2 - requires that in considering whether a person is "fit and proper" each case is considered on its own merits.

Chapter 4 – **Enforcement Policy**

Paragraph 8.1 - allows the Council to revoke any licence where it is satisfied that the licence holder is no longer, for example, "fit and proper".

Paragraph 8.2 - requires that when considering revocation, the Committee will take into account all relevant facts and circumstances including licensing objectives, and any other information thought pertinent to the matter being considered.

Paragraph 10.2 gives the Committee the discretion to direct a driver appearing before them to complete further training or retraining, should the drivers' suitability to retain a licence be called into question.


Guidance on the Relevance of Convictions

Paragraph I – states that in making its decision the Council will consider the relevance of any offence, the seriousness of the offence, the length of time since the offence occurred and any pattern of offending behaviour.

Paragraph 2 - states that contravention of licensing laws or conditions are relevant offences for considering the suitability of a person to retain a licence.

- 10. Members are made aware that Mr Journeaux has completed the BTec in Transporting Passengers by Taxi and Private Hire in July 2012.
- 11. Mr. Journeaux has been invited to attend this Licensing Committee in order that this matter may be considered.
