The nature of the proposed variation is;

The premises have been altered to extend the licensed area and add a function room with servery for the retail sale of alcohol and late night refreshment.

Toilet facilities have been moved from the function area. A newly built extension area has been added to house the toilet facilities and now include provision for the disabled.

The provision of regulated entertainment for live music is to have the terminal hour extended by 30 minutes on Friday, Saturday and Sunday nights.

The start of live music will be from 7.00pm on all nights.

ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE Steps taken to promote the four licensing objectives

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

The designated premises supervisor will be a member of the local Pubwatch scheme so long as it exists. - **REMOVE**

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

All windows will be kept closed after 22.30 hrs - REMOVE

Occasional live music in the garden area, restricted to 1 evening per month maximum, due regard to be taken regarding volume levels particularly in the later evening from 22.00 hrs, to be restricted from June through to September. **REMOVE**

Imposed conditions from Environmental Health Representative

Public Nuisance

Live and recorded music in the garden/outside area shall cease at 23.00 hrs and the doors shall be closed. - **REMOVE**

A senior member of staff (manager) will assess the impact of any noisy activities on neighbouring residential premises at the start of the activity/entertainment and periodically throughout the activity/entertainment. - **REMOVE**

Conditions above to be replaced with the ones listed below:

Prevention of Public Nuisance

- 1. The Premises Licence Holder or nominated person will assess the impact of any noisy activities on neighbouring premises at the start of regulated entertainment and periodically throughout regulated entertainment and take action to reduce noise levels if they are found to be distinguishable above background levels at the nearest residential property.
- 2. All doors and windows shall be kept shut during regulated entertainment.
- 3. The Premises Licence Holder or nominated person shall ensure that exits are manned at closing time to ensure that patrons leave the area quickly and quietly as possible.
- 4. The Premises Licence Holder or nominated person shall be available at all times during regulated entertainment and who is responsible for cooperating and liaising with any relevant responsible authority.
- 5. The Premises Licence Holder or nominated person shall ensure a telephone number is made available and displayed in prominent locations on the premises for local residents to contact in the case of noise-

nuisance or anti-social behaviour by persons or activities associated with the premises. The telephone number will be a direct number to the management who are in control during opening hours. A record will be kept by management of all calls received, including the time, date and information of the caller, including action taken following the call. Records will be made available for inspection either by any relevant responsible authority throughout the trading hours of the premises.

- 6. A specific taxi operator has been nominated for staff and customers use. The company's telephone number is advertised to customers. The operator and all drivers are aware that they should arrive and depart as quietly as possible, should not sound vehicle horns as a signal of their arrival or leave engines idling unnecessarily. In addition, staff will leave as quietly as possible, particularly at night and early in the morning.
- 7. The Premises Licence Holder or nominated person shall erect and maintain, in a prominent position at every exit a clear, conspicuous and legible notice requesting patrons to avoid causing noise, nuisance or disturbance to local residents.
- 8. The Premises Licence Holder or nominated person shall control levels of noise in the outside area and advise customers of the need to respect local residents where appropriate. Any patrons continuing to cause any disturbance or disorder will be asked to leave the premises.

Public Safety

1. The maximum number of persons (including staff and entertainers) allowed at the premises shall not exceed 180, subject to the following maximum occupancies:

Bar Area 120 persons

Function Room 60 persons

Protection of Children from Harm

1. The Premises Licence Holder or Designated Premises Supervisor shall have a written age verification policy in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. This policy will include documented steps taken to prevent adults from purchasing alcohol for or on behalf of children under 18s and will specify a Challenge 25 proof of age requirement before sales of alcohol are made as approved by the Plymouth City Council Trading Standards responsible authority.

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

- 1. A minimum of I Door Supervisor shall be employed during any function involving 18th or 21st birthday party. A risk assessment shall be carried out by the DPS to assess the level of door staff required during any other special events thereafter
- 2. The Premises Licence Holder will ensure that a CCTV system is fully compliant with the guidance contained in the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) guidance document (www.informationcommissioner.gov.uk) regarding installation of CCTV is provided at the premises.
- 3. The CCTV equipment shall be maintained in good working order and continually record when licensable activity takes place and for a period of two hours afterwards.

- 4. The CCTV system shall cover all areas of the premises to which the public have access including any outside areas.
- 5. Images shall be retained for a minimum of 31 days.
- 6. The CCTV system shall be capable of downloading images to a recognizable viewable format.

ANNEX 1 - MANDATORY CONDITIONS

- 1. The first condition is that no supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence: -
 - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. The second condition is that every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- **3.**(1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children-
- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-
- (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
- (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- **4.** The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- **5.**The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- **6.**(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

All windows will be kept closed after 22.30 hrs

Occasional live music in the garden area, restricted to 1 evening per month maximum, due regard to be taken regarding volume levels particularly in the later evening from 22.00 hrs, to be restricted from June through to September.

Imposed conditions from Environmental Health Representative

Public Nuisance

Live and recorded music in the garden/outside area shall cease at 23.00 hrs and the doors shall be closed.

A senior member of staff (manager) will assess the impact of any noisy activities on neighbouring residential premises at the start of the activity/entertainment and periodically throughout the activity/entertainment.

Management will control the sound levels of the music/entertainment.
