On or around 30 April 2013 David Elbrow, trading as Plymouth Tree Services, felled a protected Beech tree and removed a large limb from another Beech tree at Leigham Manor communal woodlands. Mr. Elbrow pleaded guilty and the total costs award to the Council was £900.00.
