Summary Report: In Plain Sight CSE

Training booked - **350+ individuals** are currently booked on (the target is 800); delivery begins at the end of September. Still waiting for responses from 6 other organisations, so there will be more trainee numbers shortly! Most bookings are from hotels currently as they were the priority target, and includes staff from Plymouth Pavilions door staff and out of hours social workers.

In Quarter 3 (Oct-Dec), the 3 x October training sessions for the VCS will take place – and POP is coordinating bookings for this.

Co-delivery with the police, to the city's door staff takes place during October.

In terms of awareness raising there has been a lot of time invested in this, including the BIG Plymouth VCS conference 17th Sept (110 attending) and Ann will be at the Plymouth University Fresher's Fair next week.

Training and awareness for those working within the **public sector** and the **voluntary & community sector** is also being undertaken.
