Digital – Using the Internet


- Free Wi-Fi and computers with skilled staff to help people make the most of the internet and digital world

Eggbuckland St Budeaux



Outreach Offer

Pop-up libraries across the city to include:

 Rhymetimes – Babies, toddlers and parents get together to sing songs and nursery thymes



 Storytimes – Parents with children under 5 get together to hear a book being read to them



 Signposting for advice and information – providing information and advice from library staff on health and other information



 Gadget sessions and online demonstrations – tips and advice on how to use ipads, tablets, ereaders and more

- Each library will have enough trained staff
