Purpose of the report:

The purpose of this report is to summarise the main points of the LGA Green Paper for Adult Social Care and Wellbeing and gain Cabinet's approval and agreement to Plymouth City Council submitting a full consultation response.

Corporate Plan:

Contributing to the LGA Green Paper aligns to the priorities of keeping adults protected and focusing on prevention and early intervention in the Plymouth City Council Corporate Plan by ensuring that Plymouth's voice is represented in the shaping of new social care legislation. The Council has committed to provide strong, democratic community leadership in decisions affecting the city, to care about the impact of the actions of others, to be open and champion fairness, and to work with partners to serve the best interests of the city and its communities.

Implications for Medium Term Financial Plan and Resource Implications: Including finance, human, IT and land:

The LGA Green Paper has no direct implications for the Council's financial planning, but will be used to inform the Government's forthcoming Green Paper on adult social care. Resulting legislation is likely to have significant financial implications for Plymouth City Council and its health and social care partners although this is not possible to quantify until government proposals are published.

A 'do nothing' option has been considered however this has been rejected due to the importance of the upcoming legislation on health and social care and the potential impact on Plymouth and its citizens.
