SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS IN PLYMOUTH KEY MESSAGES:

N.B. Analysis of complete data for Pupils with Special Educational Needs is still underway with the SEND Steering Group: Data Monitoring sub group

Most prevalent Primary need types in Plymouth are:

- 1. Social, Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH)** Of all pupils in receipt of SEN support or an EHCP: 24.1% have SEMH as a primary need within primary schools (0.9pp lower than in 2017); 28.6% within secondary schools (0.5pp higher than in 2017) and 19.4% within Special schools (0.9pp higher than in 2016).
- 2. Speech, Language and Communication (SLC)** Of all pupils in receipt of SEN support or an EHCP: 36.1% have SL&CN as a primary need within primary schools (1.5pp lower than in 2017); 14.6% within secondary schools (0.7pp lower than in 2017) and 9.3% within special schools (0.8pp higher than in 2017).
- 3. Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)** Of all pupils in receipt of SEN support or an EHCP: 6.8% have ASD as their primary need within primary schools (1.1pp higher than in 2017); 18% within secondary schools (1.7pp higher than in 2017) and 16.9% in special schools (1.2pp higher than in 2016).
- 4. Moderate Learning Difficulties (MLD)** Of all pupils in receipt of SEN Support or an EHCP: 17.2% have Moderate Learning Difficulties as a primary need within primary school (0.3pp higher than in 2017); 11.4% within secondary school (0.5pp lower than in 2017) and 11.2% at special school (1.2pp lower than in 2017)
