INCLUSIVE EDUCATION AND SCHOOLS

Plymouth City Council believes:

- children in our city should have access to education about, and awareness of, the diverse world
 we and they inhabit. This will often include the mix of family types common in modern Britain,
 which is quite separate from any form of sex or relationship education;
- all children are entitled to high quality, age-appropriate and rights-based Relationships and Sex Education that is inclusive of LGBT+ relationships;

- issuing guidance to schools to empower them to teach an inclusive curriculum and develop a whole school approach to embed equality;
- work with schools and other stakeholders to support and share good practice in promoting and delivering inclusive equality education in all schools;
- support all those who work with children and young people to carry out their work free from discrimination and harassment.
